Situation Analysis	Background: From unlocking value equivalent of 3-13% of GDP in 2030 (Digital ID[1]) to speeding growth by up to 33% (financial sector implementation[2]), DPI can turbocharge economic development. However, risks of data breaches, surveillance, and exclusion, particularly affecting women and minorities, are poised to scale in tandem. Neglect by governments and companies DPI safety and indusivity risks compromising people trust in, and the socio-economic development potential of, these transformative technologies[3],
	To shape this digital transformation towards safe and inclusive approaches, OSET and UNDP launched the DPI Safeguards Initiative, which seeks to mitigate risks of DPI to people, while empowering governments and organizations to harness its potential for the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

	[3] Citizen distrust and related political and legal action can derail the economic benefits of DPI. In Switzerland, 64% of voters rejected the Swiss eID in a 2021 referendum, citing their apprehensions regarding private companies licensed to operate it. Related legislative dynamics manifest across various countries that has slowed or limited the roll-out of DPI. The Robinson v Attorney General of Jamaica case led to the country's National Identification and Registration Act system, which gathered demographic, biometric, and biographic details, being declared unconstitutional and null, given its potential to erode trust between citizens and the state. In the landmark case of Justice Puttaswamy v Union of India, the Supreme Court directed that, in the absence of robust data protection legislation, Aadhaar could not be employed for identity verification for various essential services. The High Court's decision in Nubian Rights v Attorney General of Kenya deemed the National Integrated Identity Management System as an unconstitutional breach of privacy. The Kenyan government faced prohibitions against collecting GPS an DNA data and was restricted from making public service access contingent on national identity registration. The Supreme Court's verdict in Madhewoo v Mauritius declared the indefinite biometric retention period under the ID card scheme unconstitutional.
Rationale and theory of change	Objective: This UN High-Impact initiative aims to develop the first global DPI Safeguards Framework and promote its uptake across countries, supported by governments and relevant private sector and civil society actors.
	The overall impact of this project will be reduced poverty and inequality through safer, more inclusive implementations of DPI. This will be enabled through the activities outlined in the project Results Framework (see below section), which will be carried out in ways that align ethical, safety and other regulatory standards with universal human rights and rule of law frameworks and boost sustainable development, at a critical juncture for governance of DPI.
	Strategic positioning: The Initiative draws on OSET and UNDP's unique comparative advantages in convening power, global networks of multistakeholder partners, and leadership in digital policy development:
	<ol> <li>OSET brings the convening power of the Secretary-General and role as the focal point for digital technologies in the UN system. As part of preparations for the Global Digital Compact (GDC), OSET has been conducting multistakeholder consultations across the globe, and is uniquely placed to represent the UN's stewardship of safe and inclusive DPI and its engagemen links with the GDC.</li> <li>UNDP as the UN's lead development agency brings valuable expertise and relationships across government ministries from 170 countries and territories in the field. As a pioneer in right based digital transformation, UNDP has strategically engaged 73 countries on DPI and demonstrated leadership in global advocacy through serving a knowledge partner to the G20 India Presidency on DPI and other intergovernmental forums regionally. It prioritizes inclusion and governance in its ongoing DPI work, collaborating closely with governance teams across programme countries. UNDP is uniquely placed to combine usability with the universality of the Framework, and can foster the ecosystem for safe and inclusive implementation working with local digital ecosystems in countries.</li> </ol>
	The project will engage with key <b>partners</b> , including stakeholders in:
	<ul> <li>Existing DPI governance initiatives: The Initiative will reach out to ongoing DPI governance initiatives across stakeholder groups, including but not limited Principles on ID for Sustainable Development led by the World Bank, Principles for Digital Development led by the Digital Impact Alliance, and UNDP's own Digital ID Legal Governance Framework. The DPI Safeguards Initiative will not replace prior efforts but seeks to complement and strengthen them. Existing principles will be referenced in the Framework, as principles are developed applicable to DP in a broader sense of being a mindset or approach to digital transformation (rather than just the technical components).</li> <li>UN System: The Initiative will work closely with other UN System actors, including the World Bank.</li> </ul>
	Incorporation of UN norms: In both process and outcomes, the project will ensure that the work of the Initiative is grounded in the UN Charter, human rights and the sustainable development agenda.
	On human rights, the project will actively engage with vulnerable groups to identify and address specific risks they face in digital public infrastructures design, implementation and maintenan in countries. This will advance agendas on ensuring human rights are protected as part of DPI, indiuding safeguarding personal data, ensuring freedom of expression and information, and preventing discriminatory practices.
	On sustainable development, the Initiative will encourage government to enable local digital ecosystems to scale and innovate digital solutions in a trusted manner, accelerating progress across all 17 Sustainable Development Goals. This means there will be a particular emphasis on roles of governance and roles of the government and local digital ecosystems towards enabling DPI for reducing inequality, promoting inclusive economic growth, and fostering resilient systems.
	On gender, the project is committed to bridging the digital gender divide. It will promote gender-responsive digital public infrastructures that empower women and girls by improving access digital services, enhancing digital literacy, and supporting women's participation in the digital economy. The Initiative will also address the specific needs of women and girls to ensure that digital development is equitable and inclusive.
	(1) Lessons: have been drawn from existing initiatives and a review of key literature.
	(2) Sustainability: beyond the launch of the Framework, sustainability will be ensured by fostering a community of practice with multistakeholder governance of the Framework to continue making the Framework accessible and up-to-date. Adoption across countries and stakeholders beyond the initial scope of 3 countries will serve as exemplars for further uptake of the framewor beyond the 24-month project.

	Intellectual property: Unless otherwise agreed in writing, all intellectual property and other proprietary rights over materials which were developed by PUNOs, including third parties engaged by PUNOs, as a result of the activities of the project will belong to the United Nations.
