Discussion have also advanced with Bougainville women's federation, Bougainville youth federation, local women political leaders and economic enablers.

The new phase of the project was approved in December 2022 and the project formally started in January 2023. This will be the first semi-annual report for this phase. Recruitment for the project manager within UNDP has been completed and the candidate is on-board. UNFPA has started the recruitment for a national officer and should conclude by the end of June 2023. UN Women has started recruitment for a local staff and that should conclude by July 2023.

The project mobilization in terms of working with implementing partners and local partners has been initiated. Work is on-going to grow and deepen relationships with Government of Papua New Guinea, NCOBA and Autonomous Bougainville Government. This is mainly related to the work plans for 2023 and work associated with the Joint Supervisory Body (JSB) and Joint Technical Teams (JTT) meetings. Detailed outcomes will be outlined in ongoing discussions between both parties. JSB and JTT meetings have been delayed due to on-going negotiations but are expected to happen on 17-18 July for the JTT (Port Moresby) and 20-21 July for the JSB (Madang). Meetings have been delayed due to an impasse at the technical level to agree on the constitutional regulations, which includes the parliamentary pathway for bringing the referendum results and the joint consultations report to the floor of parliament for ratification/final decision making. The impasse has created a further delay to the JSB timelines.

The ministerial statement on Bougainville made in mid June has now provided some certainty on the next steps and will provide additional forums to advance the dialogue between ABG and GoPNG. In addition to that the project has also set in motion engagements aligned with key awareness activities related to the community and other stakeholders focused on dissemination of joint key messages through a plethora of channels (community facilitators, national adverts, women's networks and youth networks among others).

During the reporting period, consultations have been on-going with ABG and Government of PNG on support related to the peace process and plans for formal meetings related to the JSB and JTT. The discussions have not progressed as expected due to disagreements over the post referendum process and the inability for the JTT to agree on the Constitutional Regulations to bring the referendum result and joint consultation outcomes to the national parliament. This impasse has been addressed through dialogue between the National Minister for Bougainville Affairs Makiba and his counterpart in the ABG, Minister Massat to consider an alternative pathway via a sessional order. A Parliamentary Partnership workshop between the National Parliament and the BHOR took place in Lae in April. The partners subsequently issued a joint resolution providing further details on the Sessional Order.

It is expected that both Governments will be meeting at a high level in July 2023 to kick start the negotiation process. Minister Makiba, visited Bougainville in April 2023 along with a delegation of national members of parliament.

Minister Makiba was welcomed and received first hand information of the situation through engagement with the political leadership with ABG. The Minister conducted two missions to Buka: One in late March at the invitation of the ABG Minister Masatt, to attend the first BHOR sitting of 2023. Minister Makiba's delegation attended the BHOR and listened to the President's and Minister's statements. The second visit was in April at the invitation of the Regional Member to attend a boxing tournament in Arawa. Minister Makiba was part of a national delegation.

Minister Makiba made a statement in parliament about Bougainville on 13 June 2023. The statement set out the basic process for submitting the results of the referendum to the PNG national parliament which included prescribing a two thirds absolute majority, a motion to "accept" the referendum results and a minimum of three meetings of parliament between the tabling of the motion, voting and reinstating the Bougainville bipartisan committee.

A delegation of Bougainville representatives, including the ABG President, BHOR speaker and up to 10 MPs from Bougainville attended the delivery of the statement to the national parliament.

The new UN liaison officer for Bougainville started work in April 2023 and will be a focal point for the political engagement related to the post referendum process.

Progress summary Please limit your response to 350 words During the reporting period, consultations with the Bougainville Youth Federation and the Peace and Conflict Studies Institute Australia (PACSIA) for engagement with young people through participatory youth dialogue have been completed. An implementing partner agreement has been signed with PACSIA. Draft work plans have been prepared: one for signature with the ABG Department of Community Development on behalf of the Bougainville Youth Federation and the other work plan is being finalized with PACSIA. It is expected that both work plans will be signed by the end of July 2023 so implementation will start soon. Consultations with the Bougainville Women's Federation and the ABG Media Group and other independent media in Bougainville to develop a media package on the post-Referendum process are planned to be undertaken in July/August of 2023. Discussions with the Office of the High Commissioner on Human Rights in connection with the training of human rights defenders on human rights monitoring and advocacy under this outcome is ongoing. Given that this outcome requires engagement in new communities for UN Women, and as referenced in the prodoc, this reporting period has been used as a project inception period. Delays in budget setup and recruitment were experienced as a result of UN Women's migration to Quantum. However, during this period UN Women was able to hold an inception meeting with key ABG government and peacebuilding counterparts (including the Minister for Community Government, Minister for Primary Industries, BHOR Deputy Speaker, and local peacebuilder from Konnou Rose Pehei) to discuss this work and identify entry points to access the pilot communities safely. In addition, UN Women developed and advertised Terms of Reference for local and international technical consultants to support project implementation, whilst recruitment for staff is ongoing. Lastly, a Call for Proposals for Responsible Parties was issued and a selection made. Contracting for the Responsible Party will be completed by end of June with partner implementation beginning in July 2023. The partner will be responsible for the establishment of the peace-supporting businesses in the pilot communities, and will work closely with programme staff and the technical consultants.
