MOIFAR recruited a National Reconciliation and Peacebuilding Advisor (MOIFAR – UN Liaison) in line with the Capacity Injection Mechanism (CIM) –Pay & Benefits Manual – Stream B – for advisors and project staff. The position is supporting the following objectives:

- Strategic alignment and coordination of peacebuilding initiatives within government institutions and enhanced cooperation between MOIFAR, the UN system in Somalia, PBF, international partners and civil society.
- Provision of technical advice to MOIFAR to mobilize technical and financial support from and facilitate partnerships with the UN system and beyond to support gender-, youth- and conflict-sensitive peacebuilding and reconciliation interventions.

The position reports to the Chief of Programmes of MOIFAR and works in close collaboration with the PBF Secretariat. The National Reconciliation and Peacebuilding Advisor directly contributes to Activity 2.1.2: Identify and address capacity development needs of PBF partners such as MOIFAR and Steering Committee members, national partners, implementing organizations, or any other relevant partner to improve gender-, age-, and conflict-sensitive portfolio oversight, strategic guidance, political buy-in and M&E functions.

Activity 2.1.2 contributes to output 2.1: PBF Steering Committee (SC) established and its capacities built to ensure overall guidance, M&E, political support/ advocacy in relation to the SRF/ PBF portfolio.

The PBF Secretariat's work was focused on advancing our partnership with the Ministry of Interior, Federal Affairs & Reconciliation (MoIFAR), agreeing on details of a multi-year Letter of Agreement (LoA) between UNDP PBF Secretariat Project and MOIFAR. The LoA was signed at the end of 2023, enabling the deployment of a PBF-supported MOIFAR Peacebuilding and Reconciliation Advisor from April 2024 onwards. The Advisor will provide strategic alignment, coordinate peacebuilding initiatives within government institutions, enhance cooperation between MoIFAR, the UN system in Somalia, PBF, international partners and civil society, and support the establishment of a steering mechanism to promote national ownership, government leadership and steering of PBF interventions. The position will also provide technical advice to MoIFAR and the UN system to mobilize technical and financial support from and facilitate partnerships with the UN system and beyond to support conflict-sensitive peacebuilding and reconciliation interventions.

The first meeting of the PBF steering mechanism with MOIFAR, aligned with the new aid coordination architecture of the government, will take place at the end of August 2024 to approve two new projects that have been requested by MoIFAR, the Ministry of Endowments and Religious Affairs (MERA), and the Office of National Security (ONS).

MOIFAR was increasingly involved in PBF related project design, for example when shortlisting projects under the 2023 Gender and Youth Promotion Initiative (GYPI).

Staff in place and positions under recruitment: There currently is a PBF Coordinator (international staff, based in Nairobi) as well as an Operations Specialist (NOC, Nairobi) in place. The Operations Specialist, a shared position with the Somalia Joint Fund (SJF) Secretariat (30% salary contribution from PBF Secretariat Project), is supporting all operational requirements and project/ financial management functions of the new PBF Secretariat Project. In addition, a Monitoring, Evaluation, Learning and Research Specialist, also a shared position with the SJF Secretariat (50% salary contribution from PBF) was recruited and started his assignment in June 2024. This position will work with UN entities, government counterparts, and other implementing partners to strengthen SJF's and PBF's M&E systems, develop SJF's and PBF's learning agenda, ensure compliance with SJF/ PBF-related requirements to monitor and evaluate project/ portfolio performance, support information-sharing, communication, and coherence. The M&E Specialist will also work with relevant RCO colleagues to ensure information from the SJF's and PBF's investments support UN Somalia corporate reporting and compliance with information-sharing through UN INFO.

The following positions are still to be created and advertised (to be confirmed in quarter 3 of 2024, following review of positions and reporting lines in the Integrated Office of the DSRSG/RC/HC - also keeping in mind the ongoing process of working out details and timelines for UNSOM's transition to the UNCT): Gender, Youth and Inclusion Officer (NOC, Mogadishu); Administrative/ Financial Assistant (SC, Mogadishu); Finance and Integrity Analyst (G6, Nairobi) to support Secretariat and projects on overall financial management/reporting and ensuring accountability/ integrity measures for PBF funds in close coordination with PBF steering mechanism, projects, and Risk Management Unit (RMU).

Somalia does not have a PBF Strategic Result Framework (SRF). This has several reasons. Since government officials were pre-occupied with elections and subsequent formation of a new government, the new leadership of MOIFAR only agreed in early 2023 to be the counterparts for the PBF portfolio. This did not make it viable to proceed with consultations on the Strategic Result Framework (SRF) in 2022. Based on PBSO's advice in 2023, it was agreed not to elaborate a SRF in the form originally envisaged. An extensive SRF design processes may not be required in a situation like Somalia where peacebuilding outcomes of the UN system are already articulated in the UN Cooperation Framework.

The PBF Secretariat collaborated with AFPs, UNSOM, Government, donors, civil society and headquarters on PBF and peacebuilding-related issues and managed a PBF portfolio of 9 active projects in 2023 with an overall budget of USD 18.7 million, which is a small increase by USD 500,000 compared to 2022 despite no additional portfolio funds being approved in 2023 (other than for the PBF Secretariat project) as a result of a global decrease in donor contributions to PBF.

Five new PBF projects over a total of 8.5 million were approved or started in 2023. Based on project start dates/dates of 1st tranche disbursements, three projects over USD 4.5 million begun in 2023. Additionally, two 2023 Youth Promotion Initiative (YPI) projects over a total of USD 4 million were approved by PBSO in 2023 and will start implementation in July/ August 2024.

As a result of ongoing advocacy by the PBF Secretariat and UN senior leadership in 2023, PBF confirmed their interest to support up to \$7.5 million for two new projects as part of their 2024 investment pipeline ("Support to religious network as mediators building peace in Somalia" over USD 2,500,000 and "Reconciliation in Newly Recovered Areas" over USD \$5,000,000).

As result of the good collaboration with UN colleagues and Government counterparts in 2023 and 2024, and provided the above-mentioned pipeline projects get funded as planned, the PBF Somalia portfolio is growing to 9 active projects in 2024 and a total of USD 23.8 million, which would be a 27% increase compared to 2023 (but partly due to two projects needing no-cost extensions going into 2024).

Project development processes supported:

The PBF Secretariat supported UNDP, UNSOM PAMG and ROLSIG in the development of a PBF concept note for a PBF project suggesting a peacebuilding approach to address violent extremism in Somalia. Following joint advocacy work with UN colleagues in Mogadishu, the project has attracted high-level support by the two DSRSGs who supported this project during a meeting with the ASG PBSO in New York.

The PBF Secretariat facilitated the discussions on the development of a PBF concept note "Building a Foundation for Reconciliation (Build4R) - Trust, Justice and Security in Newly Recovered Areas" in partnership with the Senior Stabilization Advisor, drafted the concept note and managed the process of incorporating comments from UNDP, IOM, UNSOM (HRPG, ROLSIG, Police, PAMG, CRESTA). The project takes a peacebuilding approach to working in areas newly recovered from al-Shabaab (AS). The Secretariat advocated for a peacebuilding approach for work in these areas newly recovered from AS to prevent a relapse into violent conflict/ sliding back into AS control. The project concept was designed to provide a "proof of concept", allowing the UN and other actors to gradually expand their engagement into more areas recovered from AS. The interconnected programme developed with UN colleagues aims at supporting communities to identify immediate community priorities, agree on interim government arrangements, put in place inclusive interim security arrangements, and support restorative justice systems to meet the immediate justice needs of communities.
