3. Reason revision is being requested.

3.1 Please indicate the reason for the revision.

The proposal for phase 2 was submitted to the UNPRPD Secretariat and approved by the Management Committee. The phase 2 implementation programme has been extended to run until 31 December 2025.

3.2 Please indicate briefly changes in outputs. Please attach revised workplan.

The Accelerating Disability Rights in Cambodia (ADRC) programme has completed phase 1 in March 2024. The programme submitted the phase 2 proposal, and it was approved by the Management Committee. The phase 2 implementation will focus on legal reform and system change, capacity-building of national stakeholders, and increased participation and inclusion of rights-holders in compliance with the CRPD. A final push will consolidate efforts to reform the legislative and policy framework for Cambodia through a new Disability Law and the third phase of the National Disability Strategic Plan 2024-2028 (NDSP3). Once these are endorsed, the programme aims to accelerate capacity development and monitor the implementation of these initiatives, especially at subnational levels. It also aims to empower rights holders (Organizations of Persons with Disabilities (OPDs), Women with Disability Forums (WWDFs), and other under-represented groups) by ensuring disability are integrated into the development, implementation, and monitoring phases of the law and NDSP3. 3.3. Please explain any changes in the risk framework.

There are three additional risks below that may affect the smooth implementation of the ADRC programme in phase 2.

- 1. The movement or change in position of the senior management of the DAC and MoSVY, who is in charge of the DAC, delays the implementation progress of the agreed plan, including the development of the digital monitoring and evaluation system and the development of the national strategy and legal document related to disability. However, the technical team may seek support from the senior management of each UN agency or RCO to discuss with the chairperson of the DAC or MoSVY Minister if the agreed-upon work plans are not achieved within the timelines.
- 2. In order to further enhance cooperation between the DAC, line ministries, the Disability Action Working Group, and provincial DACs in implementing disability-related policies, specifically NDSP3, the technical team will support the DAC in fostering relationships with these institutions through meetings and capacity-building sessions.
- 3. Lack of collaboration by the local authorities (such as chiefs of commune councils) on the disability inclusion work of the Organizations of Persons with Disabilities (OPDs), Women with Disability Forums (WWDF), underrepresented groups and partner NGOs delays the progress of the ADRC programme. The project team from the respective UN agency, together with the government partners, will provide support and guidance to the OPDs, WWDFs, and NGO partners to explain the programme and relevant legal documents, including the disability law, NDSP3, and CRPD, to the local authorities.
