Conducted a series of inception meetings with preselected youth and women-led CSOs.

Also conducted a comprehensive technical and financial needs assessment to evaluate selected CSOs' financial and technical capacities regarding their integration financial management system and their overall technical capacities. Because some gaps were identified, the project conducted financial management training for FLY and made specific recommendations for the other implementing CSOs. Similarly, in response to this capacity gap, the Implementing Partners supported the conduct of financial management training, providing financial management software (Quickbook), conducting digital literacy training, and developing a database platform for FLY membership coordination at national and subnational levels. CSOs now have the technical and financial management skills to increase youth civic participation in strategic decision-making and peacebuilding initiatives.

Built the capacities of 24 representatives from 12 Women-led and Youth-led organizations/networks in digital literacy and advocacy to serve Trainers. They were also trained on social media and other digital platforms to advocate on issues related to peacebuilding, human rights, and gender equality.

The project has recruited national and international consultants to revise the National Youth Policy and Action Plan 2019-2023 and develop a costed Implementation Plan for 2025-2030, reflecting current realities and prioritizing interventions that empower Liberian youth to reach their full potential. Regional and national consultations are being held in November 2024 to gather youth people's insights and perspectives, ensuring that youth's developmental needs and interests are incorporated into the revised policy.

Additionally, the project has built the capacities of 24 representatives from 12 Women-led and Youth-led organizations/networks in digital literacy and advocacy to serve Trainers. They were also trained on social media and other digital platforms to advocate on issues related to peacebuilding, human rights, and gender equality.

The project supported the development of Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) for Atayee Centers and Peace Huts to increase women's participation in the predominantly male civic and political platform and youth participation, respectively.

The project procured digital literacy materials, including televisions, laptops, speakers, mobile phones, and digital printers, to be presented to 12 youth and women-led organizations and NGOs to engage better in advocacy and community development efforts.

The project also supported the Ministry of Justice in reviewing and advancing the draft National Human Rights Defenders (HRD) Policy.

In assessment stages at the different Atayee Centers and Peace Huts the perspectives and issues were discussed with possible solutions. During the inception workshop also, there was a segment training the participants on the importance of inclusion in the project.
For example, the first training (activity 1.1.1) was attended by 16 female participants (out of 36 participants), a figure that will hopefully increase during future activities, given the interest and enthusiasm shown by female participants, some of whom are leaders and driving forces of community-based organisations and student unions.
