#### SUMMARY DESCRIPTION

Under the leadership of the Deputy Special Representative of the UN Secretary-General, Resident and Humanitarian Coordinator for Somalia (DSRSG/RC/HC), Enablers III will enhance quality control, promote transparency and ensure value for money by providing risk management, expert advice, oversight and enhanced coordination to the UN family in Somalia. Specifically, Enablers III will focus on:

- Providing efficient and proven solutions through system-wide services such as risk management; coordination support; and tailored advice.
- Facilitating collaboration on the humanitarian-development-peace nexus and cross-cutting issues that assist those most in need: durable solutions for displacement affected populations, environment and climate change, youth, gender mainstreaming and resilience.
- Improving coherence, coordination and complementarity of UN programming, good offices and advocacy in line with NDP-9 and Agenda 2030 commitments.
