3. Reason revision is being requested.

3.1 Please indicate the reason for the revision.

During the first year of implementation, the focus of the programme has been on developing networks and collaborations within pilot countries, capacity building activities and development of knowledge products. However, implementation has proceed slower than expected due to unforeseen programmatic risks, as well as contextual challenges in the piloting countries, leading to the necessity to extend the implementation period by 6 months.

The main delay has resulted from the evidence review underlying the development of the mapping tool, which proved to be more complex than expected and required a reorientation of the search strategy as well as additional dedicated evidence searches. The evidence review was completed in March 2024, a draft Mapping tool was completed in June 2024 and validation with the international expert groups commenced on July 2024. Two rounds of external expert validation and consensus building were completed in October 2024. Delays in the development of the review have affected all downstream activities and it is expected piloting and report drafting will be delayed overall by 6 months with respect to the original planning. In country policy dialogue events will subsequently be delayed to Q2 2025.

In addition to internal delays, the policy context in the two implementation counties (including health emergencies, political instability, changes in government affecting policy priorities and ministerial focal points) has also contributed to slow progress in stakeholder engagement and the considered decision to delay in country implementation activities.

The expected completion date for the project is therefore 1 July 2025, rather than the originally planned 1 January 2025.

3.2 Please indicate briefly changes in outputs. Please attach revised workplan.

The outputs of the programme are not subject to change, rather the timeline for their implementation is being extended.

All outputs foreseen in the original project proposal and listed in the revised workplan (attached) will be delivered by 1 July 2025.

3.3. Please explain any changes in the risk framework.

An updated risk framework is attached. Two main changes have been operated with respect to the original assessment:

- 1. The risk assessment at project proposal phase identified as a high impact contextual risk the shift of policy focus and priorities in response to other health emergencies / changes in government. Originally evaluated as low likelihood, this risk is considered as medium likelihood due to the political situation in the two implementation countries and the region more broadly. To mitigate this risk PUNOs have started discussions and preparations for in country events with local stakeholders.
- 2. Similarly, the programmatic risk of delays in implementation causing cascading delays for downstream tasks, while considered low likelihood at implementation phase has become a serious concern, which can only be addressed through the extension of the implementation phase. With the mapping tool development and validation completed, no other pending project tasks can cause delays across the two implementation countries. To mitigate any country specific delays, the PUNOs have started planning and preparations for in country events, in cooperation with local stakeholders.
