During the reporting period, the project regional technical committee meeting was held on May 28, 2025. Following the last project steering committee meeting held on October 30, 2024, and two successive regional technical committee meetings held on July 30, 2024, and October 17, 2024.

Over the past six months, the project has engaged with government entities across four countries to strengthen collaboration and align efforts with national and regional priorities. These multi-level engagements over the last six months have strengthened collaboration, garnered validation, and secured support for project activities across all four countries.

In Nigeria, the project collaborated closely with federal and state institutions. At the federal level, coordination with the Ministry of Water Resources and Sanitation and the Northeast Development Commission (NEDC) has integrated peacebuilding into broader recovery frameworks. At the state level, partnerships with Adamawa SEMA, Borno's Ministry of Reconstruction, Rehabilitation and Resettlement (MRRR), and Yobe SEMA have facilitated locally tailored implementation, timely validation of proposals, and enhanced technical oversight. Participation of national technical committee members in coordination meetings, capacity-building, and workshops has increased ownership, understanding of peacebuilding methods, and institutional capacity, supporting sustainability and scaling beyond the project's lifespan.

In Chad, engagement focused on the national government via the PBF FNS-Chad initiative. Presentations at the RSF-Chad national meeting resulted in approval of annual work plans and terms of reference for CSO engagement by the governors of Lac and Hadjer Lamis. Collaboration with the Minister of Budget, Finance, and Planning, who chaired the project board meeting, demonstrated high-level support. In April 2025, the project engaged with the Provincial Action Committee, comprising humanitarian and development partners, aligning activities with national priorities. A virtual meeting on May 30, 2025, established the National Technical Committee in Chad, reviewing its Terms of Reference to promote governance and regular meetings.

In Cameroon, the project established strong partnerships with regional governors of the Far North and North. These collaborations led to formal endorsement of work plans, active cooperation with ministries, local authorities, and traditional leaders. The signing of a detailed action plan, high-level participation at project launches, and ongoing involvement of authorities reinforced support for CSO-led peacebuilding efforts in the Lake Chad Basin. In Niger, engagement was facilitated through civil society organisations operating within the governance framework of the Peacebuilding Fund and the Stabilisation Facility. Strategic dialogues with the Governor of Diffa and the Regional Council facilitated alignment. At the same time, technical collaborations with regional monitoring units ensured effective communication with national and regional governments about project activities and planned actions

Since the initiation of the project, significant progress has been made in completing key preliminary and preparatory activities, laying a strong foundation for the main implementation phase. The UNDP has appointed national project officers/focal points in all four countries on a 50% cost-share basis and has appointed an acting Programme Manager and an Administration and Finance Officer to oversee day-to-day operations and implementation. Several planning coordination meetings with representatives from all four countries were held. These meetings helped develop and validate the project's Annual Work Plans (AWPs), the terms of reference for the call for proposal/expression of interest for CSO selection, formalising the national technical committee, establishing reporting requirements, and familiarising stakeholders with the project implementation arrangement. In collaboration with the regional governor's offices, PBF officers at the RCO's office, and technical committee structures, the activity workplans were reviewed, validated, consolidated, and subsequently approved by the project board. In addition, dedicated planning and coordination meetings were held with all partners across the four countries, as well as with UNDP regional and country offices, the PBF, the LCBC Secretariat, and the RCO, to ensure a shared understanding of roles and responsibilities and enhance collaboration.

As a result, the project has successfully launched calls for proposals in 8 territories of the Lake Chad Basin (Chad, Cameroon, Niger and Nigeria) and the regional call for proposals resulted in the selection of 50 local CSOs forming consortium of 27 finalized joint proposals in Cameroon (4), Niger (4), Nigeria (14) and regional activities (5) respectively. While all 50 CSOs have signed the agreement, 37 of these CSOs have received funds and commenced activities in their respective countries during the reporting period. These selected CSOs are collaborating with community-based organisations and grassroots associations to strengthen local peace-building efforts and ensure the sustainability of their work, focusing on addressing security issues affecting communities in the region. This peace-building initiative has supported the peaceful reintegration of internally displaced persons and raised awareness about women's rights and inclusive management of natural resources. It also supports livelihoods and environmental sustainability. Across the four countries, more than 100 members of local CSOs were also supported in developing grant funding proposals, gender mainstreaming, and project implementation. This has enhanced community resilience, social cohesion, and economic empowerment, particularly for women and youth across the region.

The project preparatory activities and the delay encountered during the launch of calls for proposals and the selection of the CSO have impacted the proposed time set envisaged for the attainment of the planned output areas. Since implementation began, the team has encountered hurdles related to the project's unique criteria for identifying Civil Society Organisations (CSOs), requiring the formation of consortia across countries and the need for CSOs to be registered in the Lake Chad Basin Commission (LCBC) DIMS directory. Resistance from some countries to using the DIMS system, especially where dedicated agencies already managed CSO lists, further complicated the process. Additionally, operational issues such as poor internet connectivity and language barriers caused delays in communication and responses from CSOs. Despite multiple extensions of the call for proposals, response rates from eligible organisations remained limited. While the project has already achieved meaningful results in certain pilot countries, an extended timeline will allow CSOs to fully finalise community-led activities and maximise the project's impact. For instance, in Chad, the call for proposals was launched twice; however, none of the applicant organisations met all the eligibility criteria, including registration on the DIMS platform. This significant obstacle prompted the Regional Technical Committee to grant Chad a waiver during a virtual meeting on May 28, 2025, allowing for the relaxation of this criterion. To enhance capacity, training was conducted for all eligible CSOs on the registration process and project criteria, with over 25 representatives of different CSOs in attendance. As a result, the process is relaunched with the target of finalising the process and signing contracts with the selected CSOs by the end of June 2025. Therefore, a project no-cost extension will enable us to implement all activities with due with full compliance with result-based management requirements, including the final reporting requirements. To achieve its objectives and recommends a no-cost extension to extend the project's timeline to ensure the successful completion, delivery, and sustainability of results.

Over the past several months, the project implemented numerous capacity-building initiatives across the four countries to empower communities and civil society organisations (CSOs). These activities have strengthened community resilience, fostered social cohesion, and built the capacity of CSOs, contributing to sustainable peace and development across the involved countries.

In Cameroon: A community needs assessment identified conflict drivers, guiding tailored interventions, Sensitization campaigns led to the establishment of peace and advisory committees, including women mediators in three communities: Kolofata (10 women, 11 men), Limani (16 women, 9 men), and Amchidé (14 women, 6 men). Outreach on women's rights reached 475 people (350 women, 125 men). Through community consultations and peace committee dialogues involving 720 participants (192 men, 192 women, 168 boys, 168 girls), conflicts relating to IDP reintegration, water management, pastoral disputes, and family conflicts were addressed. For example, water point management committees in Gancé and Kolofata set schedules and water allotments, reducing disputes and improving community cohesion. In neighborhoods, dialogues between previously conflicting neighbors helped restore communication. The project strengthened four community-based organizations (ASDHD, ASODI, women's associations of Kolofata, youth & women platform), benefitting 80 individuals, including 36 women and girls. Initiatives like supporting women's tailoring groups with sewing machines boosted local economies. Furthermore, 20 youth and 9 community groups received training in agriculture—benefiting 150 people—and women's groups learned to nurture and sell tree seedlings, advancing livelihoods and environmental sustainability. The impact was highlighted during a monitoring visit, with beneficiaries from Mayo Oulo and Limani reporting increased income, expanded production, and improved livelihoods, especially among women and youth.

Nigeria: The project enhanced CSO capacities and community security. Thirty security personnel (8 women, 22 men, including 19 youth) from military police and volunteer groups in Adamawa received training on security, human rights, early warning, and conflict-sensitive approaches. This led to prioritising mediation over force, reducing violence. The project supported the reintegration of 50 former armed group associates through case management, psychosocial support (37 women, 13 men), reconciliation committees, and vocational training. Additionally, 50 local peace mediators (16 women, 34 men) sharpened conflict resolution skills, and a water handpump in Boskeri was rehabilitated, providing water to over 500 residents.

In Niger, the project achieved significant results through CSO, and community interventions promoted peace and resilience. Twenty-four media professionals (11 women, 13 men) from eight radio stations were trained in conflictsensitive reporting, producing 24 peace-promoting programs reaching around 500,000 people. Livelihood resilience was strengthened through vaccinating 69,211 livestock in various municipalities improving animal health and contributing to the local economy and constructing 200 km of firebreaks that protected 10,000 hectares of pasture and 25,000 livestock, reducing bushfire risks. Five community project management committees (totalling 52 members, including 30% women) were established and trained to manage local development. The project also trained 50 women in sustainable agriculture, environmental protection, and non-violent conflict management across three groups, leading to the development of a 3-hectare market gardening site benefiting 125 women, generating 600,000 FCFA income, and providing tools and water via solar boreholes. Youth engagement included dialogue platforms and sports tournaments involving over 50 youth (including 15 girls), fostering peace and unity. At the regional level, the project strengthened collaboration and capacity among civil society organisations (CSOs) across four countries through targeted engagements and joint planning efforts. The project facilitated interactive sessions for over 100 CSO representatives, focusing on proposal development, selection criteria, implementation strategies, and reporting processes. As a result, five CSO consortia (comprising 10 organisations) developed and finalised joint project proposals, with four groups (eight CSOs) successfully signing grant agreements and receiving their first tranche of funding, thereby officially launching their project activities. To ensure technical coordination and alignment, the project convened three regional technical committee meetings, enhancing cross-border collaboration and harmonising implementation efforts. Additionally, a Project Board Meeting was held, providing strategic oversight and reinforcing good governance and accountability in project delivery. The project also demonstrated strong results in reporting, with the first and second progress reports compiled and submitted to the Peacebuilding Fund (PBF) within the required deadlines, reflecting transparency and progress in implementation. Furthermore, a joint monitoring mission was conducted in Niger and Cameroon (Phase I), enabling real-time assessment and fostering shared learning a cross-country team.

Lastly, in Chad, while efforts to engage local CSOs through Calls for Proposals (CFP) faced challenges—most notably a lack of applications from accredited CSOs—training sessions enhanced capacity in proposal writing, and meetings https://ee.kobotoolbox.org/single/fFZac3Jo

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with the Provincial Action Committee introduced the project. A key barrier was limited internet connectivity in Lake Province, hindering online submissions. In response, the project expanded eligibility criteria beyond DIMS accreditation, allowing more CSOs from the Lac and Hadjer Lamis regions to participate in future calls. The Empowerment and Inclusion of Women and Youth (Pillar 9) is a core component of the Regional Strategy for the Stabilisation, Recovery and Resilience of the Boko Haram-affected areas of the Lake Chad Basin. The project supports the integration of Pillar 9 by building CSO capacity on gender and youth inclusion in peacebuilding. In Nigeria, during the thematic workshop, CSOs deepened their understanding of the transformative role of women and youth in peacebuilding, with knowledge levels increasing by 11%. Gender mainstreaming was integrated throughout the workshop, including two focused sessions led by a UNDP gender expert on gender sensitivity in DDRRR and empowerment and inclusion in peacebuilding. Through case studies and peer exchange, CSOs recognised the critical impact of inclusive approaches in building resilient communities. Gender and youth inclusion were also reflected in participation, with an average of 48% women and 52% men, and 75% youth across the capacity-building activities and the workshop. In Cameroon, the project applied a gender-sensitive approach to promote peace and social cohesion. Women actively participated in dialogues, awareness campaigns, psychosocial support, and advocacy activities, contributing to SDGs 5 and 16 and advancing UNSCR 1325 on women's role in peacebuilding. 80 participants (including 36 women and girls) were trained on responsible citizenship, peace, mediation, GBV prevention, and cross-border dialogue. 20 female mediators and 20 youth peace club members received two-day training and supported community outreach and GBV case identification. Activities on positive masculinity led to 26 men stopping child marriages, 23 protecting 29 women from domestic violence, and 68 men and boys engaging in GBV awareness efforts. Through three exchange meetings, 60 women gained leadership, negotiation, and management skills. Peer learning among women's groups further strengthened community leadership. Four women's associations developed and matured microprojects to address local needs: Women's Platform – Kolofata; Anti-GBV Group - Kolofata; Women's Groups - Gance and Women's Groups - Amchidé In Niger, the process of identifying associations was based on the principle of equality to ensure fair representation for both young people and women. As a result, 26 Civil Society Organisations (CSOs) and Community-Based Organisations (CBOs) were identified in the project's areas of intervention. Among these, 15 organisations are led by

women, while 11 are led by young individuals. These organisations received training in gender mainstreaming, project management, and community recovery approaches in the Diffa region. The training was tailored to address the specific needs of civil society organisations, focusing on the needs of young people and women

From Conflict to Coexistence: The Story of Elhadji Hamidou Goni, a Resilient Pastoralist in Al Bourdj, Diffa region in Niger. Elhadji Hamidou Goni practiced transhumance—a traditional form of livestock herdingacross the borders of Niger, Nigeria, and Cameroon. Alongside his family, he moved herds of large and small ruminants in harmony with the seasons, following wellestablished pastoral routes. However, the emergence of the Boko Haram crisis drastically disrupted this way of life. The insecurity in the region made cross-border movement dangerous, forcing many herders, including Elhadji, to settle in more secure areas. This sudden concentration of pastoralists led to increased pressure on natural resources such as water and grazing land. Tensions escalated between communities, particularly between the Fulani (Peul) and Arab groups. These disputes over access to resources turned violent. Tragically, Elhadji lost several of his brothers, fellow Fulani herders, during these clashes.

"We had reached a point where the conflict with the Arab community we lived alongside had become unbearable. They killed my brothers," Elhadji recalls.

A Turning Point: The PBF Project

Amid this turmoil, the Peacebuilding Fund (PBF) project was introduced in Al Bourdj. Its goal was to foster dialogue and reconciliation between conflicting communities.

"The project first brought us together to talk, to listen, and to seek a peaceful solution," says Elhadji.

Through facilitated discussions and community engagement, the project helped rebuild trust and open lines of communication. Over time, the hostility began to fade. Today, we have almost forgotten the conflict, thanks to the intervention of the PBF project. I am truly grateful," he adds. A Message of Hope Elhadji Hamidou Goni's story is a powerful example of how dialogue and community-led peacebuilding can transform

lives. From the depths of loss and conflict, he and his community have taken steps toward healing and coexistence.

Economic empowerment through the provision of printing and photocopying machines to enhance financial independence for young people and disincentivise the desire to join violent extremist groups

Madji Alamine is a 21-year-old inhabitant from Kolofata, a border Town with Banki, Nigeria and one of the hardest hit communities by Boko Haram in the Far North region of Cameroon. Despite pressure from some of his peers to join the terrorist group, he remains among the few youths in the community who have refused to be radicalised. He dropped out of the University of Maroua during his second year due to the nefarious consequences of the activities of Boko Haram. As a school dropout and unemployed youth in Kolofata, he was identified by the CSO SAHELI, which trained him in income-generating activities. He was given a printer and a photocopy machine, which he believes will help him expand the business, provide employment to other youth in the community and facilitate the completion of his university studies. "I am Madji Alamine from Kolofata. Boko Haram has destroyed everything in my community. I had friends who decided to go to the bush and become members of the terrorist group. I refused to join them, but things continued to be very difficult with many of us being unemployed. Thanks to SAHELI, i was identified, registered and with support from PBF funds, I was given a brand-new Printer and photocopy machine, which is a source of income and employment to me. It is the only printing and photocopying machine in Kolofata. Before this machine was given to me, we had to cover 20 to 25 km to print or photocopy a document. Today, we have this at our disposal thanks to the PBF project. This machine will

help me to construct and expand my business, recruit unemployed youth in my community"

The project has significantly improved women's livelihoods while promoting environmental sustainability. By training women's associations of Mayo Orlu in nursery management and the commercialisation of tree seedlings, the project has increased household incomes, enhanced environmental regeneration, and strengthened community cooperation. As a direct result of these skills, the women-led groups secured a contract to supply over 10,000 seedlings to a donor-funded afforestation initiative, demonstrating not only improved economic opportunities for women but also the lasting relevance and sustainability of the project's impact on both people and the environment.

The beneficiary communities of Albourdj, primarily consisting of Peulh and Arab members, have acknowledged the important role that civil society organisations (CSOs) play in fostering social cohesion.

They have received comprehensive support, including training and awareness-raising campaigns focused on coexistence, which have encouraged mutual acceptance and increased tolerance. Additionally, vaccination campaigns have helped protect their livestock and reduce conflicts associated with disease transmission risks. Both communities have shared that, following a previous conflict, they stopped speaking to or acknowledging one another. However, thanks to the interventions of UNDP and CSOs, they have reconciled and are now living together in harmony.

In Nigeria, 50 former associates of armed groups were reintegrated into their communities in Adamawa. They were provided support through case management, psychosocial support (37 women, 13 men), reconciliation committees, and vocational training skills.

The proposals submitted by the selected Civil Society Organisation (CSO) groups include a section on sustainability by prioritizing the revitalization of existing community mechanisms and platforms rather than creating parallel structures. This approach ensures continuity, relevance, and local ownership of peacebuilding efforts. By strengthening CSOs' institutional capacities—including resource mobilisation, financial management, and leadership development—the project has empowered women- and youth-led associations, community leaders, and local actors to independently sustain peace and social cohesion. These community-led structures are now better equipped to carry forward the project's gains beyond its lifecycle.

In terms of financial sustainability, the initiative aligns with the Regional Strategy for Stabilisation, Recovery, and Resilience (RSS-SRR) by equipping local CSOs across Nigeria, Niger, Cameroon, and Chad with tools and resources to remain active contributors to regional peacebuilding.

As a key sustainability milestone, the project contributed to the development of the DIMS platform, adopting DIMS as a single gateway for selecting and supporting CSOs and CBOs involved in peacebuilding. To deepen this impact, the project is currently finalising additional funding from the African Development Bank (AfDB) to digitise and upgrade the DIMS directory. This will enhance coordination, visibility, and access to funding opportunities for local organisations, positioning them for long-term engagement beyond the current project.

Across the countries, the need for a no-cost extension was raised by several CSO groups and the Technical Committee members during coordination meetings and joint monitoring missions. This request stems from the delayed selection of CSOs and finalisation of agreements, which has led to a late start in the implementation of some joint CSO proposals.

Given the ongoing capacity-building efforts focused on strengthening CSO competencies in peacebuilding project implementation, particularly in areas such as reporting, financial management, and overall project cycle management, a no-cost extension is essential to ensure the effective delivery of results.

Additionally, CSOs have highlighted that the current project budget limits their ability to fully address the range of needs identified by communities. Considering this, there is a strong recommendation to expand the project's scope and increase budget allocations to enhance responsiveness and impact at the local level.
