Project progress summary Please limit your response to 6000 characters A PBF secretariat is set up in the DRC and functioning; staffing was an issue during the reporting period, but the main tasks of the S-PBF were successfully completed.
A Joint Steering Committee also exists in the DRC under the co-presidency of the national Vice-Prime Minister, Minister of Plan and of Development Assistance Coordination, and the Resident Coordinator. Several line ministries participate in the COPIL, including the ministries of youth and gender, the P-DDRCS as well as civil society organization. During the reporting period, the top PBF donors as well as the Forum for International Non-Governmental Organizations (INGO-Forum) were invited to the COPIL. The COPIL allows for strategic discussions on the entire PBF portfolio on the DRC.
In order to ensure adequate governance in line with the convening role of the PBF, provincial Steering Committees under the leadership of the governors of Kasai/Kasai Central, Tanganyika and South Kivu are established and functioning. All three CPP met during the reporting period at least once, including the South Kivu's inception meeting on 14 November 2024.
Project-level technical committees also exist for various projects.
During the reporting period, the S-PBF conducted one civil society workshop on PBF monitoring and evaluation requirements (April 2024) as well as joint monitoring missions, with national counterparts, to South Kivu and Tanganyika provinces (November 2024).
The S-PBF also supported the independent portfolio evaluation conducted by COWATER as well as the elaboration of the PBF eligibility which expires in 2024.
