The Joint Steering Committee (JSC) did not convene during the reporting period due to several stakeholder engagement events organized by the UN system in Liberia including consultations in the development of the new					
Cooperation Framework and events around the UN@80 commemoration. There were also a series of engagements around Liberia's recent election to the United Nations Security Council as a non-permanent member where key members of the JSC were actively involved making it difficult to hold the meeting.					
That notwithstanding, the PBF Secretariat under the leadership of the RC convened a special UNCT meeting on 19th					
June that was attended by Heads of Agencies under the PBF portfolio to review progress and strategize on enhanced implementation and strengthened collaboration.

The project actively engaged the Government of Liberia through key ministries-including Internal Affairs, Foreign Affairs, Justice, Defense, State, Youth & Sports, and Gender to strengthen coordination, planning, implementation, monitoring, and reporting mechanisms. These engagements took place at both strategic and technical levels. In addition, the PBF Secretariat worked closely with the Liberia Institute of Statistics and Geo-Information Services (LISGIS) to enhance data-driven planning and evidence-based decision-making. This collaboration aimed to improve the availability and quality of statistical information critical for monitoring peacebuilding progress and informing policy interventions.

A particularly notable milestone was the Deep Dive National Consultation on Sustained Peace, co-hosted by the Government of Liberia and the UN Peacebuilding Support Office. This two-day event, held on October 22–23 in Monrovia, marked the launch of the Peacebuilding Impact Country Spotlight: Unpacking Liberia's Peacebuilding Journey – Evidence, Impact, and Lessons for Sustained Peace. The consultation highlighted Liberia's path to peace, the gains made and mechanisms in place to sustain the peace.

The event brought together representatives from government ministries and agencies, civil society organizations, international organizations, diplomatic missions, and academic institutions such as the University of Liberia. High-level government officials in attendance included the Minister of Internal Affairs, the Deputy Minister for International Cooperation at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and the Deputy Ministers of Justice, Youth & Sports, among others.

From the UN and Peacebuilding Support Office, participants included heads of UN agencies, the UN Resident Coordinator, and the Deputy Director of the Peacebuilding Support Office in New York. The consultation featured panel discussions with peacebuilding experts and individuals with deep knowledge of Liberia's journey toward sustained peace.

As part of ongoing efforts to strengthen results-based monitoring and reporting, the Secretariat, in collaboration with UNICEF and other UN agencies, engaged the Liberia Institute of Statistics and Geo-Information Services (LISGIS) to support data collection for the remaining indicators under the Strategic Results Framework (SRF). This engagement helped address data gaps and ensure that progress across PBF-supported interventions is measured using credible, nationally validated sources. Throughout the year, LISGIS worked closely with the Secretariat and relevant UN agencies to design and implement a targeted survey focused on peacebuilding outcomes, including community perceptions of security, access to justice, and inclusive governance.

Key milestones in the process included:

- Technical consultations to align survey tools with SRF indicator definitions.
- Data collection across 168 communities in 9 selected counties where PBF projects are active.
- Data validation involving government stakeholders, UN partners, and civil society representatives

  Preliminary findings from the survey were being reviewed and attached as annex to the 2025 PBF Secretariat Annual

  Report.. This collaboration with LIGIS marks a significant step toward institutionalizing evidence-based monitoring

  and enhancing national ownership of peacebuilding results.

#### **Coordination & Strategic Engagement:**

The Secretariat facilitated collaboration among UN agencies, government, and CSOs, ensuring alignment with national priorities and the PBF Strategic Results Framework. The Deep Dive Consultation convened diverse stakeholders to review Liberia's peacebuilding progress and lessons learned.

#### **Impact Areas:**

Strengthened gender-responsive and community-based peacebuilding (peace huts, palava huts).

Promoted youth engagement and socio-economic empowerment, including the National Youth Policy (2025–2029). Enhanced rule of law, security, and human rights institutions.

Supported integrity institutions like the Liberia Anti-Corruption Commission and Liberia Land Authority.

Advanced cross-border trade and regional collaboration to mitigate threats such as drug trafficking and security harassment.

These efforts contributed to institutional and behavioral change, supporting democratic transitions post-UN mission (2018).

**Monitoring & Evidence-Based Reporting:** 

Partnered with LISGIS to implement a national survey addressing SRF data gaps, providing credible data on social cohesion, governance, and conflict prevention.

#### **Project Development:**

Finalized a \$3M gender proposal, "Strengthen Her Voice", to enhance women's access to justice and peace, implemented by UN Women, OHCHR, and Kvinna till Kvinna. Supported concept note development for a transitional justice project with UNDP, IOM, and OHCHR.

#### **Field Engagement:**

Joint missions to Grand Cape Mount and Gbapolu showcased results in land governance, cross-border peacebuilding, and environmental conservation, with strong community ownership.

#### **GOLA REAP Cross-Border Project:**

Provided technical guidance for Steering Committee meetings, ensuring coordination, accountability, and incorporation of lessons learned from previous projects.

#### **Regional Partnerships:**

Continued engagement with AfDB and MRU through monthly technical meetings, supporting the establishment of the MRU Fragility & Resilience Observatory and resource mobilization efforts. #### characters):

The Secretariat continues to work closely with Civil Society Organizations (CSOs), UN Agencies, and both national and international partners to mobilize resources through Peacebuilding Fund (PBF) opportunities, with a focus on Gender Equality and Women's Empowerment as well as Youth Inclusion and Responsiveness.

A key initiative under this effort is the finalization and approval of the Gender 2.0 Project and the ongoing development of the concept note titled "Strengthening the Capacity of National Stakeholders to Implement a Holistic and Victim-Centered Transitional Justice Process for the Promotion of Sustainable Peace and Development in Liberia." This concept note is currently under review by the Peacebuilding Support Office (PBSO).

The proposed intervention seeks to enhance the ability of national actors to lead and implement a comprehensive transitional justice process that places victims at the center, contributing to long-term peace and development in Liberia. To support the Secretariat and three UN agencies—UNDP, IOM, and OHCHR—in strengthening the concept note toward a full project document (ProDoc), PBSO focal point for Liberia conducted a brief support mission to Liberia following his engagement in Sierra Leone in early November.

During this period, PBSO mission worked closely with the agencies and the Secretariat to provide technical guidance, with the goal of finalizing the concept note by the end of 2025 and developing a full proposal in early 2026. The PBSO missionalso joined a joint field visit to key PBF-funded project sites in Grand Cape Mount and Gbarpolu Counties, which share borders with Sierra Leone. These counties host two major initiatives:

- 1. GOLA REAP Project implemented by WFP and IOM and co-implemented by CSOs including Talking Drum Studio Liberia and the Society for Conservation of Liberia. focusing on cross-border peacebuilding and resilience.
- 2. Land Governance Project implemented by UNDP, UN Women, and WFP,

During the field visit, the team engaged meaningfully with farmers, community members, and local authorities at the Gola Protected Forest Park. Discussions centered on forest regeneration, sustainable land use, and the importance of community ownership in land governance. These conversations underscored the critical role of environmental preservation in sustaining peace and securing livelihoods for future generations.

The Support to PBF Secretariat Project has played a pivotal role in enabling UN agencies, the Government of Liberia, and civil society organizations (CSOs) to demonstrate tangible outcome-level peacebuilding results. By strengthening coordination, monitoring, and reporting mechanisms, the project has ensured that peacebuilding interventions are not only implemented effectively but also measured against clear, evidence-based indicators. Through the Secretariat's technical support, UN agencies have improved the quality and consistency of project reporting, aligning outputs with the Strategic Results Framework (SRF). This has allowed stakeholders to track progress on critical areas such as inclusive governance, social cohesion, and conflict prevention. The engagement with the Liberia Institute of Statistics and Geo-Information Services (LISGIS) to collect data for remaining SRF indicators further reinforced the credibility of results, providing nationally validated evidence of impact.

For the Government of Liberia, the project facilitated high-level consultations and technical dialogues that informed policy decisions and strengthened national ownership of peacebuilding priorities. Initiatives such as the Deep Dive National Consultation on Sustained Peace showcased Liberia's progress and lessons learned, while fostering multistakeholder collaboration.

CSOs benefited from capacity-building and inclusion in monitoring processes, ensuring that community perspectives and grassroots experiences are reflected in outcome-level reporting. Field missions to PBF-funded projects in Grand Cape Mount and Gbarpolu Counties highlighted concrete results in land governance, cross-border peacebuilding, and environmental conservation-demonstrating how local actions contribute to national peacebuilding goals.

Overall, the project has moved beyond activity-level reporting to demonstrate measurable changes in trust, participation, and resilience, confirming its contribution to sustained peace and development in Liberia.
