The project has engaged and supported the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, International Cooperation and Communities, through the General Directorate for the Coordination of CSOs (DGCANG) to consolidate a structured dialogue between the State and Civil Society Organizations.

The citizens' convention strengthened confidence between the State and civil society organizations, which led to the delivered of its recommendations and methodology, to the Prime Minister, instructing the Ministry of Economy, Planning, and Regional Integration the appropriation of the documents produced by the citizens. The process of drafting the new National Development Plan, led by the Ministry of Economy, Planning, and Regional Integration, has led to the sectoral dialogues between several Ministries and the CSOs, incorporating the recommendations from the Citizen Convention reflecting the voices of the population and communities.

During the reporting period, the project has supported a nationwide consultative and participatory process which gathers civil society organizations, community leaders and local groups from a broad geographical and ideological spectrum of Guinea-Bissau. The Citizens' Convention initiative led by the main civil society networks in Guinea-Bissau and supported by the project and the EU funded Good Governance project, was essential to ensure the Citizen voices and participation are heard at very high level. Two Women Led organizations, Network of Women Mediators (REMUME), Centre for Studies and Research on Women and Gender (CEPEMG-GB) and Bandim's Grandchildren Cultural Group, supported to implement activities of the project (A:2.3.1) on the debate of memory and social inclusion, the role of women in the liberation struggle, identification of areas, personalities, and symbolic places (Catió, Bolama and Cacheu) that marked the affirmation of the State of Guinea-Bissau, to strengthening social cohesion and the appreciation of collective memory.

Partnership agreements with the following implementing partners NATCOM (UNESCO National Commission), SINJOTECS (Union of Journalists and Social Communication Technicians), RENARC (National Network of Community Radio and TV Stations of Guinea-Bissau) and LGDH (Guinean League for Human Rights), have been finalized and they are now implementing the residual activities of outcome 3.

The project contributed to strengthening dialogue, trust-building and collaboration among political and social actors in an extremely fragile context marked by demonstrations and restrictions on civic space. It engaged civil society organizations (CSOs) under the Electoral Monitoring Cell (CME) and other actors working on the prevention of electoral violence, supporting the implementation of the CSO Roadmap on Elections (1.1.5). In preparation for the November 2025 elections, the project reactivated the UN Task Force on Elections and assisted the National Electoral Commission (CNE) in organizing the September 2025 international workshop on Lessons Learned and the Workshop on Elections in the Digital Era (1.1.4).

In line with promoting inclusive political participation, the project catalyzed youth engagement by supporting the institutionalization of the National Forum of Youth Party Organizations on 22 May 2025 (1.1.2). This platform enhances the contribution of young people to national dialogue and democratic processes. Similarly, support to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs enabled the establishment of a multistakeholder platform for government–Coordination (1.1.7). After its first meeting in October 2024, the platform began convening quarterly. From January to June 2025, the project supported its joint secretariat composed of DGCANG and CSO representatives. On 12 February, the project assisted in the co-organization of National NGO Day, where CSOs and government agreed on recommendations to strengthen civic participation and engagement in public policy. The dialogue enabled DGCANG to negotiate conditional exemptions for NGOs despite the continued application of Order No. 66/2022.

The project continued to support the Citizen's Convention (www.convencaocidada.gw), a nationwide participatory process. In April 2025, a planning workshop gathered 55 CSO leaders to design a strategy for structured dialogue with the State (1.2.5). Restitution sessions in May engaged more than 250 regional participants, leading to the consolidation of recommendations for the Prime Minister. Between July and October 2025, selected CSOs held sectoral dialogues with Government on 10 priority themes (1.2.7), with results fed into the Citizen's Convention monitoring system. The Ministry of Economy subsequently adopted the methodology and recommendations to inform the drafting of the new National Development Plan (August–October 2025), ensuring that community voices and regional inputs shaped national planning.

From January to October 2025, the Political Stabilization and PACE projects supported ENA's Leadership Academy in training women political candidates across the regions (2.2.3; 2.2.8). A total of 265 women from multiple political parties were trained in Bissau and seven regional centers, contributing to greater female participation in political and leadership spaces.

Between 5 and 10 November, the project strengthened national conflict-prevention capacity through the development of a joint conflict-analysis and early-warning methodology with the CME and CNCAER. Approximately twelve CSOs and CNCAER's Human Security Analyst contributed to a unified analytical framework supported by innovative tools, including an AI-based qualitative survey (Sensemaking Chatbot) with 40 respondents and a quantitative control survey. Two joint reflection sessions validated the findings. As a result, CME produced Guinea-Bissau's first consolidated conflict analysis and early-warning report, to be submitted to the Prime Minister through CNCAER on 15 December.

The project also advanced media engagement as a peace actor. In collaboration with LGDH, it supported an inclusive mechanism for monitoring hate speech during the electoral period, complemented by training for journalists and CSOs, including persons with disabilities. A preliminary report on hate speech prevalence was published in September 2025 and will inform the National Forum on Hate Speech scheduled for 14 November (3.3.1). Community media capacities were strengthened through a practical workshop with RENARC in July, enhancing inclusive dialogue spaces and improving talk shows and political debates (3.2.1).

To counter disinformation ahead of the 23 November elections, media actors operating the fact-checking platform Factcheck GB (<https://factcheck-gb.org/>) participated in a regional learning workshop and a practical training in Bissau on effective electoral fact-checking (3.3.3). Factcheck GB developed an operational strategy, including dissemination of audio fact-checked content to community radios (3.3.4). To promote journalist safety, security forces received training on public order and freedom of expression (3.1.4), and consultations were initiated to convene the first strategic meeting of the National Coordination Committee for the Safety of Journalists (3.1.5).

Overall, the project significantly strengthened the engagement and capacities of media and civil society—both in the capital and the regions—as actors for peace, democracy, and social cohesion. Efforts to counter disinformation and hate speech, reinforce community media, and promote journalist safety contribute to a more resilient and informed public sphere ahead of the 2025 elections.

The project has placed significant emphasis on empowering rural women through targeted capacity-building in human rights, entrepreneurship, leadership, and access to justice. Endline data indicates notable improvements among the 2,550 targeted rural women: 24.82% demonstrated enhanced human rights knowledge, 15.32% strengthened their entrepreneurship skills, 10.94% improved their leadership abilities, and 9.48% advanced their access to justice. Importantly, 23.35% reported progress across all four domains, reflecting a holistic empowerment outcome.

Advancing Gender Equality and Women's Empowerment, alongside youth inclusion, remained a core project priority. A total of 265 women candidates from 11 political parties (50 from Bissau and 215 from the regions) benefited from political leadership training based on UN Women's standardized curriculum. Themes included public speaking, campaign strategy, political communication, and transformative leadership. A practical booklet compiling challenges and solutions identified by participants was produced to support broader mobilization and sustain peer driven strategies that promote women's autonomy and collective action in politics.

Between August and September, the project supported REMUME, CEPENG-GB and Netos de Bandim in conducting regional "Djumbais" in Cacheu, Catio, and Bolama to document the experiences of women involved in the national liberation struggle. These activities strengthened recognition of women combatants, generated a preliminary oral archive of testimonies, promoted intergenerational dialogue, and highlighted the role of Mandjuandade women as agents of resilience and cohesion. The initiative will culminate in a National Conference in December to present key findings.

The Citizens' Convention, supported by the project, further promoted gender equality and youth inclusion by engaging around 1,500 participants—702 of them women—from more than 150 CSOs nationwide. Through inclusive consultations, the Convention contributed to a reform roadmap and strengthened the (www.convencaocidada.gw) platform, enabling coordinated CSO advocacy and dialogue with government authorities.

The Leadership Academy expanded grassroots engagement by implementing a strategic plan and delivering capacity-building to local leaders, particularly young women, to enhance participation in political and reform processes. Complementary efforts strengthened cooperation between journalists and law enforcement to promote human rights and freedom of expression. Community media outlets, especially women-led or women-focused, received support to produce inclusive and high-quality content, contributing to a more informed, participatory, and equitable public sphere.

The Political Stabilization project has significantly impacted the people of Guinea-Bissau through comprehensive support to civil society organizations (CSOs) and strategic collaboration with international partners. The project has been pivotal in enhancing electoral integrity, transparency, and fostering democratic governance, thereby positively affecting the societal fabric of the nation. Following the dissolution of Parliament in December 2023, the project demonstrated resilience and adaptability by rallying diverse CSOs to form the Electoral Monitor Cell (EMC).

Currently, for both Legislative and Presidential elections on November 23, the EMC is monitoring the electoral process, including the support of signing of code of conduct of political parties and Media, held on November 03 2025. Historically, these organizations had been divided into political lines. However, the EMC unified them, enabling a coordinated response to oversee the June 4 legislative elections. The establishment of a monitoring centre and the deployment of 200 CSO monitors across all regions ensured comprehensive oversight.

A notable milestone was the signing of a political party's code of conduct, which represented a collective commitment to fair and peaceful elections. The ceremony, attended by key government officials and the Resident Coordinator's Office, underscored a unified dedication to upholding democratic principles. This pledge was a significant step towards restoring public confidence in the electoral process.

The project's emphasis on civic education and capacity building was instrumental in empowering citizens to exercise their voting rights. Extensive voter education campaigns and targeted training workshops were conducted, significantly enhancing the electorate's understanding and participation.

Collaboration with other PBF projects, such as PBF CDO and PBF Human Rights, further strengthened the project's impact. The training of law enforcement officers on maintaining public order while respecting human rights was another critical aspect of the project. These training sessions aimed to instill a balance between security and democratic principles. Officers who participated in the training reported a shift in their approach, emphasizing the protection of citizens' rights during the electoral process. This change was evident in the peaceful conduct of the elections and the increased sense of security among voters. This partnership also involved extensive human rights training for 169 law enforcement officials, focusing on democratic policing and the protection of human rights during elections. These sessions, held in various regions, equipped officers with the necessary skills to manage electoral-related challenges effectively. The training fostered a rights-based approach to law enforcement, contributing to a safer and more inclusive electoral environment.

The project's success was particularly evident during the June 4 parliamentary elections, where monitors reported a marked reduction in election-related violence. The EMC's comprehensive monitoring framework ensured adherence to electoral procedures, thereby safeguarding the integrity of the elections. This achievement was widely recognized and appreciated by electoral supervisory entities, political parties, and international electoral observation delegations.

The collaboration with international partners and the comprehensive support provided to civil society networks have created an environment conducive to free, fair, inclusive, and transparent elections. These initiatives have not only strengthened electoral integrity but also built confidence in the democratic processes, ensuring a lasting impact on the political stability of Guinea-Bissau.

To ensure the long-term sustainability and ownership of the project, significant efforts have been directed toward: The sustainability of the Leadership Academy beyond project life: (i) positioning the Leadership Academy and the National School of Administration (ENA) as a hub for training leaders and connecting agents of change. The Academy offers specialized courses on diverse and impactful themes, including peacebuilding, conflict analysis and resolution, mediation and dialogue, and political leadership. Complementing these efforts, the Academy and ENA are adopting a robust fundraising strategy at both national and international levels to sustain the program's achievements and advance an inclusive approach where every voice contributes to building consensus for sustainable development. (ii) Secondly, the ongoing implementation of the Academy's strategic plan, developed with ENA's team, supported by International Consultant, along with its collaborative work with civil society organizations within a dedicated consultation space, lays the foundation for strengthening peace infrastructure. This initiative not only empowers individual leaders but also strengthens institutional capacities, ensuring that the skills and knowledge gained is embedded within local structures.

The sustainability of the Citizens' Convention initiative and website: (i) In order to support the promoters of the convention to maintain the website and develop a communication strategy, including for social media, the project is supporting the communication team of the citizens' convention to implement the i-participate platform in Guinea-Bissau; (ii) By creating a dedicated website the project has provided a digital space where CSOs can share information, coordinate efforts, and engage with the public on various thematic areas such as gender equality, youth employment, and human rights. This platform ensures that the dialogue and collaborative efforts initiated during the project, it continues to evolve and adapt to emerging challenges and opportunities.

In addition, the project has supported the development of a fact-checking platform aimed at countering disinformation, misinformation, and hate speech. This initiative is crucial in maintaining a reliable flow of information, which is essential for informed decision-making and the protection of human rights. The project has built a cadre of skilled individuals capable of sustaining these efforts and promoting journalistic integrity long after project closure.

Furthermore, the project has enhanced the early warning capacity of the state through the coordination of efforts between CSOs and the Early Warning and Response (EWR) National Center. The project is supporting the deployment of the i-report platform to support sharing information and upscale early warning tools used by CSO observatories, including the Electoral Monitor Cell (EMC).
