The initial success was rooted in assisting the Government, Organizations of Persons with Disabilities (OPDs), and Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) to advance the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD) through strengthening disability-inclusive Accountability and Governance, promoting Equality and Non-discrimination, and adopting CRPD-compliant Budgeting and Financial Management approaches. | <p>Significant progress was made toward strengthening the capacity of national stakeholders to advance disability-inclusive policies and systems in Eswatini. The programme focused on building institutional knowledge, strengthening technical capacities, and equipping stakeholders with practical tools to operationalize disability inclusion in line with the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD) and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).</p> <p>A key achievement was the implementation of four national capacity-building trainings led by the Deputy Prime Minister's Office with technical support from UN agencies and partners. These trainings reached approximately 430 stakeholders from government institutions, Organizations of Persons with Disabilities (OPDs), and development partners. The training covered critical areas including CRPD-compliant budgeting, disability-inclusive governance and coordination, non-discrimination, disability-inclusive service delivery, and coalition building for advocacy. Post-training assessments indicated that 86% of participants reported increased knowledge and capacity to design or strengthen policies and systems that promote disability inclusion.</p> <p>The programme also strengthened the role and engagement of OPDs in national policy processes. A total of 18 OPDs participated in capacity-building activities, enabling them to better contribute to policy dialogue, advocacy, and implementation of disability-inclusive initiatives. Their participation enhanced representation of persons with disabilities in national decision-making processes and reinforced the principle of "nothing about us without us."</p> <p>In parallel, the programme supported sector-specific institutional capacity development to ensure that disability inclusion is embedded within national systems. In the health and education sectors, training was provided to Monitoring and Evaluation and information management teams on integrating disability indicators into the Health Management Information System (HMIS) and the Education Management Information System (EMIS). Capacity building was also provided for health care workers and teachers on using newly improved information systems. These efforts strengthened the ability of sector institutions to collect, analyze, and use disability-disaggregated data for planning inclusive services, thereby improving evidence-based decision-making.</p> <p>Further progress was made in strengthening frontline service delivery capacity. A total of 319 healthcare workers, including nurse managers and regional mentors, were trained on newly developed Standard Operating Procedures for Neonatal Disability Screening including up to five years. This intervention enhanced the capacity of health facilities to detect early signs of disability, improve documentation, and establish referral pathways for specialized care and social support services. Early identification contributes to improved health outcomes and strengthens linkages to social protection and other support programmes for children with disabilities.</p> <p>Complementing these capacity-building efforts, the programme developed and disseminated several knowledge products and practical tools to support disability-inclusive policy and system development. These included guidelines for integrating disability indicators into national data systems, research on barriers to participation for persons with disabilities, a costing study on children with disabilities, and a draft national advocacy strategy. These tools provide government institutions and partners with practical guidance for mainstreaming disability inclusion across sectors.</p> <p>Collectively, these interventions contributed to strengthening institutional knowledge, improving coordination mechanisms, and equipping national stakeholders with practical tools to advance disability-inclusive policies and systems. The programme therefore laid an important foundation for sustained progress in implementing the National Disability Plan of Action and advancing the rights and inclusion of persons with disabilities in Eswatini.</p> |

Substantial progress was made in addressing key systemic gaps required to advance the implementation of the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD) in Eswatini. The programme focused on strengthening policy frameworks, improving national data systems, and piloting inclusive service delivery models to ensure that disability inclusion is embedded within national development and service delivery systems.

A major milestone was the operationalization of the National Disability Plan of Action (NDPA) 2024–2028 through the development and validation of a costed implementation framework. Through a series of national consultative processes involving government institutions, Organizations of Persons with Disabilities (OPDs), and development partners, the programme supported the Deputy Prime Minister’s Office to develop a comprehensive costing of the NDPA. This process strengthened national capacity to mobilize resources, prioritize disability-inclusive interventions, and advance the implementation of the Disability Act and national commitments to inclusive development. The costed plan also provides a practical framework for aligning disability inclusion efforts with national planning processes and the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

The programme also contributed to strengthening national information systems to support disability-inclusive planning and monitoring. Technical support was provided to the Ministry of Health and the Ministry of Education and Training to integrate disability indicators into the Health Management Information System (HMIS) and the Education Management Information System (EMIS). As a result, national guidelines were developed to guide the systematic collection, management, and use of disability-disaggregated data within these systems. These improvements lay the foundation for the progressive generation of reliable data on persons with disabilities, enabling government institutions to better monitor service access, inform policy development, and strengthen accountability for inclusive service delivery.

In addition, the programme supported the development of an inclusive healthcare service delivery model to strengthen early identification of disabilities among newborns. Standard Operating Procedures for neonatal disability screening were developed and rolled out across maternity health facilities nationwide, establishing a standardized approach to identifying developmental risks and disabilities at birth. The intervention strengthened referral pathways between health facilities and specialized support services, while also enabling stronger linkages to social protection and other support programmes for children with disabilities and their families.

A significant milestone from Phase 1 has been successfully achieved; the establishment of the Secretariat, as mandated by the Disability Act of 2018. This key objective provides the essential institutional framework required to coordinate, monitor, and implement disability-inclusive policies across the government and private sectors. The focus is now shifting to ensuring the Secretariat is fully operational with key leadership in place. The recruitment process for the critical, high-level positions of Director and Registrar is currently underway. These appointments are central to providing strategic direction and administrative oversight for the organization’s mission to champion the rights and welfare of persons with disabilities. The successful and timely conclusion of this recruitment phase is paramount to maintaining the momentum and ensuring the effective implementation of the Act’s provisions.

Collectively, these interventions addressed several structural gaps that have historically limited the effective implementation of disability-inclusive policies and services. By strengthening policy frameworks, improving disability data systems, and introducing inclusive service delivery models, the programme contributed to building the institutional foundations required for sustainable and rights-based disability inclusion in Eswatini. These efforts position the government and its partners to more effectively advance the rights of persons with disabilities and ensure their inclusion in national development processes.

| In 2025, the programme supported the Deputy Prime Ministers Office to implement the National Disability Act through institutional strengthening of the national disability coordination mechanism (established with support from the programme in 2024). Results also included the Government being supported technically and financially to undertake five (5) national capacity building training on the preconditions required by any Member State to effectively advance disability rights. These trainings reached an estimated 430 multi-stakeholders from five (5) entities from Government and Organization of Persons with Disabilities (OPDs). The government was also supported to adopt the CRPD-Compliant budgeting approach for increased resource allocation and mobilization for disability inclusion. Interventions continue to contribute to increased coordination, knowledge and skills on disability rights for inclusive SDGs and Agenda 2030. In addition, the programme reached a total of 41 chiefs with disability inclusion information that sought to enhance and strengthen their capacity to accelerate the implementation of the disability plan. |

The training focused on building technical knowledge and practical skills on the application of national guidelines for integrating disability indicators and disability-disaggregated data into the EMIS. A total of 21 participants were trained, including 13 EMIS Officers and 8 representatives from partner institutions. **Output 2.1B**

Health Management Information System (HMIS) and Education Management Information System (EMIS) improved/ Strengthened through integrating disability data and indicators

**Brief narrative description on completion of output**

The programme supported the Government to strengthen national systems for the early identification of children and young people with disabilities and to improve the availability and use of disability-disaggregated data for planning inclusive services. This support focused on strengthening the Health Management Information System (HMIS) and the Education Management Information System (EMIS), to align with the proposed Disability Management Information System (DMIS) under the Deputy Prime Minister's Office (DPMO).

In the health sector, the programme provided technical assistance to the MoH to develop HMIS Guidelines on how to include disability indicators in the Client Management Information System (CMIS). The guidelines established practical procedures for integrating disability indicators and screening tools into routine health data collection processes. As part of this work, early identification screening tools for disability and developmental delays among children were adapted for use by healthcare personnel, school health officers, and community health volunteers. These measures strengthened the capacity of the health system to identify children with disabilities earlier and generate disability-related data across health facilities, community platforms, and school health services.

In parallel, the programme supported the MoET to develop Guidelines for Disability Indicator Inclusion in the Education Management Information System (EMIS). These guidelines provide practical guidance on integrating disability indicators into EMIS and establishing systematic mechanisms to identify, document, and monitor learners with disabilities within the education sector. The EMIS will progressively generate disability-related data from schools, strengthening national data on learners with disabilities.

The EMIS guidelines also support the integration of disability screening data into EMIS in alignment with the proposed DMIS framework under the DPMO. This will contribute to establishing a centralized repository of disability data for the education sector that can be used by government institutions, non-governmental organizations (NGOs), Organizations of Persons with Disabilities (OPDs), and United Nations agencies to improve coordination and streamline the delivery of disability-related services and interventions. Importantly, the system will produce disability-disaggregated data that reflects the diversity of persons with disabilities, supporting more targeted and inclusive policy and programme responses.

The strengthened data management systems laid the foundation for improved early identification of children with disabilities, stronger referral pathways between health and education services, and increased availability of reliable disability-disaggregated data for evidence-based decision-making. These improvements also enhanced the ability of government and partners to consolidate disability-related information from multiple sources, including sector ministries, development partners, and OPDs.

This milestone strengthened Eswatini's national systems for the early identification and referral of neonatal disabilities. The tools outlined in this guidance will be used to inform the development process of that system.</p> <p>When conducting the training some of the issues that were noted were the challenges experienced by health facilities when attempting to identify possible disabilities early which included limited confidence among some health workers in recognizing early developmental concerns, inconsistent documentation of suspected cases and delays in referral due to unclear referral pathways.</p> <p>Importantly, early identification facilitates linkages to social protection and support programmes, including disability grants, psychosocial services, and support for Orphaned and Vulnerable Children (OVCs). This integrated approach improves the likelihood that children with disabilities and their families receive the support they need at the earliest stages of life.</p> |

Organizations of Persons with Disabilities (OPDs) throughout the implementation cycle, meeting the target of 3 dedicated capacity buildings (Indicator 1.1.5). Overall, of the estimated 430 stakeholders reached, **261 were female**, significantly higher than the 169 male participants, indicating a strong focus on gender inclusion. Furthermore, the training topics explicitly covered "addressing Gender-Based Violence towards women and girls with disabilities and under-represented groups," directly strengthening their knowledge and capacity to advocate for their rights and address intersecting discrimination, as confirmed by the **86%** of stakeholders reporting increased knowledge and capacities.

How did women with disabilities and women led OPD groups (informal/formal) participate in the implementation?

Women with disabilities and women-led Organizations of Persons with Disabilities (OPDs) participated directly in the implementation of Output 1.1A, which focused on enhancing the capacity of national stakeholders to accelerate the operationalization of the National Disability Action Plan. Specifically, the four major national capacity-building workshops organized by the Deputy Prime Minister's office explicitly targeted women with disabilities and ensured that women-led OPDs participated throughout the programme's implementation cycle. One of the topics covered in these trainings was addressing Gender-Based Violence towards women and girls with disabilities and under-represented groups, indicating a thematic focus on their specific rights and requirements. Out of the total estimated 430 stakeholders reached across all trainings, 261 were female participants, demonstrating a high level of inclusion in the capacity-building efforts. Furthermore, the programme met its target of capacity building activities directed at women and girls with disabilities, with all four national trainings ensuring their participation and focus on their rights.

#### 4. Full and effective participation of persons with disabilities

Please describe how the programme ensured the full and effective participation of persons with disabilities and their representative organizations by responding to the questions below.

How did the programme consider the barriers faced by persons with disabilities for effective participation?

The programme team in partnership with Government, facilitated the participation of OPDs through ensuring that their Reasonable Accommodation needs were met e.g. through provision of sign language interpreters, accommodation, transport or transport reimbursement for persons with disabilities that had participated.

Accessible venues for activities were often sought to ensure that barriers of physical accessibility were addressed. It must be noted that although service providers had fully accessible venues, the programme team did their best to ensure that accessibility issues were addressed throughout the Programme's implementation cycle.

How were persons with disabilities involved in the programme's governance as well as in the planning, implementation, monitoring and evaluation phases?

The National Disability Technical Working Group and the Inter-Ministerial Committee on National Disability Affairs, established with support from the Round 4 Programme is inclusive of diverse OPDs. OPDs have not only been involved in the design, implementation of the project, but have been meaningfully engaged in all programme activities. For example of the estimated 55 Multi stakeholders that participated in the development of the Costed National Disability Plan of Action framework, a total of 16 OPDs who included 23 persons with disabilities were meaningfully engaged.

The Eswatini programme has ensured that the meaningful engagement of diverse persons with disabilities is prioritized in compliance with principles of the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities. The OPDs were involved in leading some of the activities which included the advocacy strategy development, conducting the barriers study and facilitating for some of the capacity building activities. This ensured their

involvement and participation, not as recipients but also as resource persons. FODSWA is also a co-chair of the National Disability TWG which is a critical role that they play in the disability programming governance.

How have the specific actions undertaken by the programme contributed directly to the full and effective participation of persons with disabilities?

The programme team ensured that diverse groups of persons with disabilities participated in the programme not just as participants, but as resource persons, key national dialogue and decision making platforms. This resulted in increased awareness raising on the rights of persons with disabilities and self advocacy on the issues that affect them.

In addition, OPDs were trained alongside government officials and development partners, strengthening their ability to engage more effectively and articulate their needs with clarity and influence. They greatly contributed to the development of the National Disability Plan of Action (NDPA) and regulations for the Persons with Disability Act of 2018, embedding their perspectives into national law and strategy. OPDs were extensively consulted during the development of the Advocacy Strategy for Disability Inclusion and consultations included NGOs, CBOs representing OPDs and OPD rights, as well as National Disability Council.

## 5. Ensuring the inclusion of marginalized and underrepresented groups of persons with disabilities

*Please describe how the project ensured inclusion of marginalized and underrepresented groups of persons with disabilities by responding to the questions below.*

*How did the programme consider and identify marginalized and underrepresented groups of persons with disabilities? for example by considering type of disability, gender, age, location, minority status or other contextually appropriate demographic factors.*

- The Programme worked with the Deputy Prime Ministers Office and Umbrella Body FODSWA to identify underrepresented and marginalized persons with disabilities. Examples include ensuring that OPDs that represent women, children with disabilities, persons with psychosocial and intellectual disabilities participating in the national disability coordination mechanism, as well as the development of national mechanisms such as the NDPA and its costed framework, capacity building and in the study.
- Special emphasis was placed on women with disabilities, acknowledging their heightened vulnerability to gender-based violence and barriers to participation. By the end of the year, a dedicated symposium and indoor games were organized specifically for women with albinism and Deaf women, ensuring their voices and experiences were meaningfully recognized.
- Disability data and indicators were integrated into health (HMIS) and education (EMIS) systems, allowing disaggregation by disability type for more tailored service delivery as well as a Standard Operating Procedure to strengthen Early identification Screening.

*In what way did the programme advance equity regarding rights and needs of most marginalized groups?*

It prioritized women and children with disabilities, recognizing their heightened vulnerability to exclusion and gender-based violence. Specific initiatives, such as a symposium and indoor games for women with albinism and Deaf women, ensured visibility and tailored engagement for groups often overlooked.

*How have the specific actions undertaken by the programme contributed directly to the inclusion of marginalized and underrepresented groups of persons with disabilities?*

The programme greatly supported the inclusion of marginalised and underrepresented groups of persons with disability through engagement and capacity building. The groups that the programme directly impacted were women and girls with disability, persons with down syndrome and persons with albinism. As part of inclusion children with disabilities voices were heard during key engagements and sensitization mainly children with down syndrome.

*How did marginalized and vulnerable persons with disabilities and these groups led by marginalized and vulnerable persons with disabilities (informal/formal) participate in the implementation?*

Marginalized and vulnerable persons with disabilities, including those represented through Organizations of Persons with Disabilities (OPDs), actively participated in the implementation of programme activities through consultations, capacity-building initiatives, and policy dialogue platforms. Representatives from OPDs were engaged in national and sectoral consultations related to the implementation of the National Disability Plan of

Action and other programme activities, ensuring that the perspectives and priorities of persons with disabilities informed programme design and implementation. These groups also participated in training and knowledge-exchange activities aimed at strengthening their capacity to advocate for disability-inclusive policies and services. Through this participatory approach, the programme promoted the principle of “nothing about us without us,” ensuring that persons with disabilities contributed to decision-making processes and to shaping interventions that directly affect their lives.

## 6. Partnership-Building

*Please provide a narrative on how the programme has contributed to greater UN inter-agency collaboration to advance the rights of persons with disabilities in the country.*

The Eswatini Programme has strengthened partnerships to advance disability rights using the multistakeholder approach that brings Government, OPDs and different UN Agencies. The Round 4 Programme has contributed to strengthening the coordination roles of the Deputy Prime Minister's Office and Umbrella Body FODSWA. Strengthened partnerships has resulted in increased awareness raising on the UNCRPD and advancement of the National Disability Act. The Round 4 Eswatini Programme has contributed significantly in providing the technical and financial support that was required to advance the rights of persons with disabilities. The UN has since established a coordinating mechanism for disability inclusion which seeks to strengthen disability mainstreaming in the UNCT. This has been a direct result of the programme.

*Please describe the different stakeholders (for example Government departments, UN entities, OPDs and Civil Society) involved and how they worked together.*

In the duration of the Project programme a wide range of stakeholders worked together in a coordinated way to advance disability inclusion:

Government departments: The Deputy Prime Minister's Office (DPMO) played a central role, alongside ministries such as Finance, Justice, Health, and Education. Each ministry appointed disability focal persons and engaged in training on disability-inclusive budgeting, planning, and reporting. This ensured disability issues were mainstreamed across all government sectors rather than confined to a single line ministry.

UN entities: Agencies like UNFPA, UNICEF, UNESCO, collaborated closely. They provided technical expertise, capacity building, and oversight. For example, UNICEF focused on integrating disability data into health and education systems, while UNESCO supported the costing of the National Disability Plan of Action. UNFPA coordinated the programme and led advocacy efforts.

Organizations of Persons with Disabilities (OPDs): The Federation of Organizations of Persons with Disabilities in Eswatini (FODSWA) unified OPDs under a common platform. They strengthened advocacy, coordinated at local and regional levels, and ensured persons with disabilities were directly involved in decision-making and programme implementation.

Civil Society Organizations (CSOs): Groups such as CANGO contributed to coalition building, advocacy, and grassroots engagement, ensuring that disability inclusion was addressed at community level.

Together, these stakeholders established and operationalized structures like the National Advisory Council for Persons with Disabilities, the Inter-Ministerial Committee, and the Technical Working Group on disability mainstreaming. These platforms allowed government, UN agencies, OPDs, CSOs, and international partners to jointly design policies, develop tools (such as the Disability Mainstreaming Handbook and Service Directory), and coordinate advocacy. This collaborative approach created a unified voice, strengthened accountability, and laid the foundation for systemic change in disability inclusion.

In addition, the programme partnered with the European Union in implementing some of the activities including capacity building of policy makers and screening.

*How has the programme contributed to generating new knowledge on how best to promote the rights of persons with disabilities to support policy and system changes?*

According to the proposal document, the UNPRPD programme in Eswatini has contributed significantly to generating new knowledge on how best to promote the rights of persons with disabilities, which in turn supports policy and system changes.

Knowledge products such as the draft Advocacy Strategy and the Study on Barriers were developed to serve as practical resources, offering stakeholders clear guidance on mainstreaming disability inclusion while identifying gaps that have hindered progress on disability issues.

The programme facilitated studies and frameworks, including the Disability Grant Design Study and the outline of a Disability Management Information System. These generated new insights into financial support mechanisms and data systems for disability inclusion, informing future policy directions. Furthermore by training policymakers, planners, and OPDs on CRPD-compliant budgeting, reporting, and advocacy, the programme created a knowledge base within government and civil society. This shifted disability inclusion from a line-ministry issue to a cross-sectoral responsibility, embedding it into especially education, health, and youth policies.

*Please also describe in this section any unique expertise and products developed by the programme that could be used to support other countries within a south-south cooperation framework*

There were a number of Unique expertise products developed during the course of the programme that can be very resourceful to the South South cooperation framework such as

1. Guidelines for integrating disability data and indicators into education (EMIS) and health (HMIS) management information systems, offering a template for other countries seeking to embed disability data into national systems.
2. Disability Grant Design Study that explored financial support mechanisms for persons with disabilities, generating insights that can inform social protection policies elsewhere.
3. The Standard Operating Procedure document for facilitating newborn screening in Eswatini's health facilities as an innovative approach that, once documented, could serve as a best practice for other countries aiming to strengthen early identification and inclusive health services.

## 7. Creation of knowledge products

*How has the programme contributed to generating new knowledge on how best to promote the rights of persons with disabilities to support national level policy and system changes?*

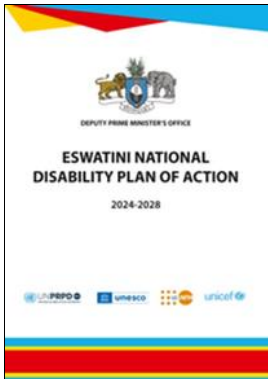
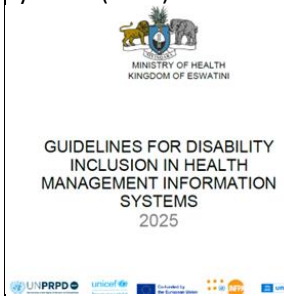
*Please also describe in this section any unique expertise and products developed by the programme that could be used to support other countries within a south-south cooperation framework*

The Programme contributed to frameworks such as the National Disability Plan of Action (2024-2028) ([Link Eswatini National Disability Plan Action 2024-2028 - UNESCO Digital Library](#)). The Costed Plan for this framework benefitted from lessons learned from a similar national costing process of the Zimbabwe Coated Plan for the National Disability policy which was also supported by the Global Disability Fund Programme. The Eswatini NDPS and Cost Plan can be also used for cross learning with Zimbabwe and other Member States on what has worked well and how disability financing can be strengthened in Southern Africa.

The Standard Operating Procedure document for facilitating newborn screening is another product that can be used to support other countries. The experience we had when developing the document was that there was limited literature for such an undertaking.

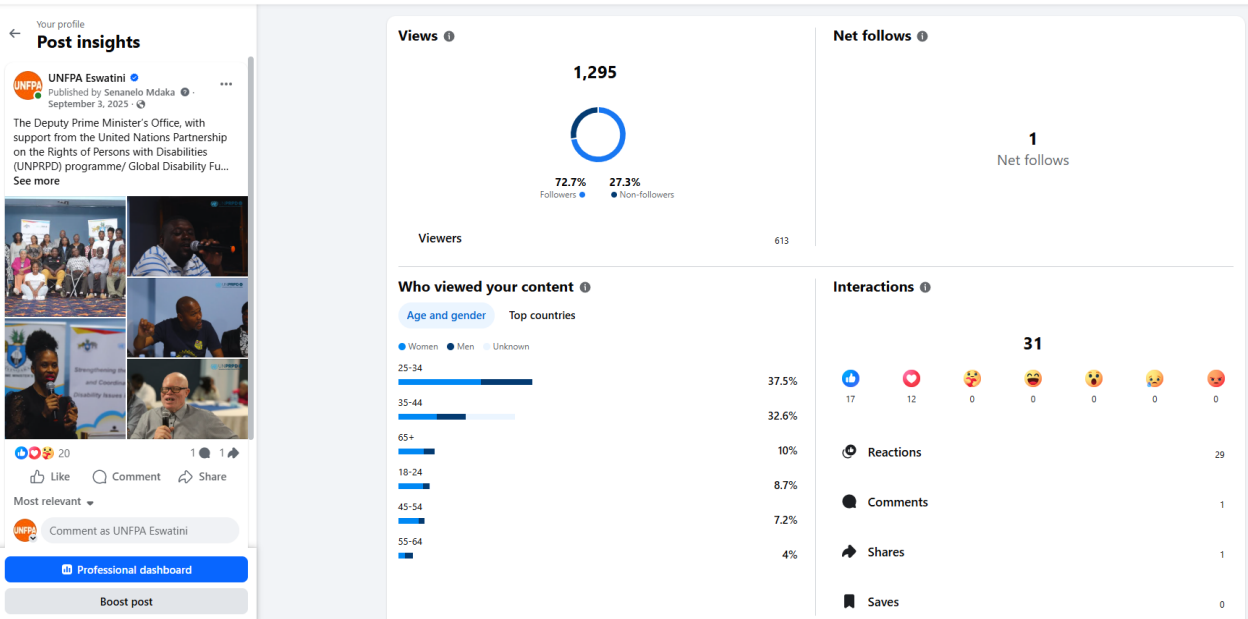

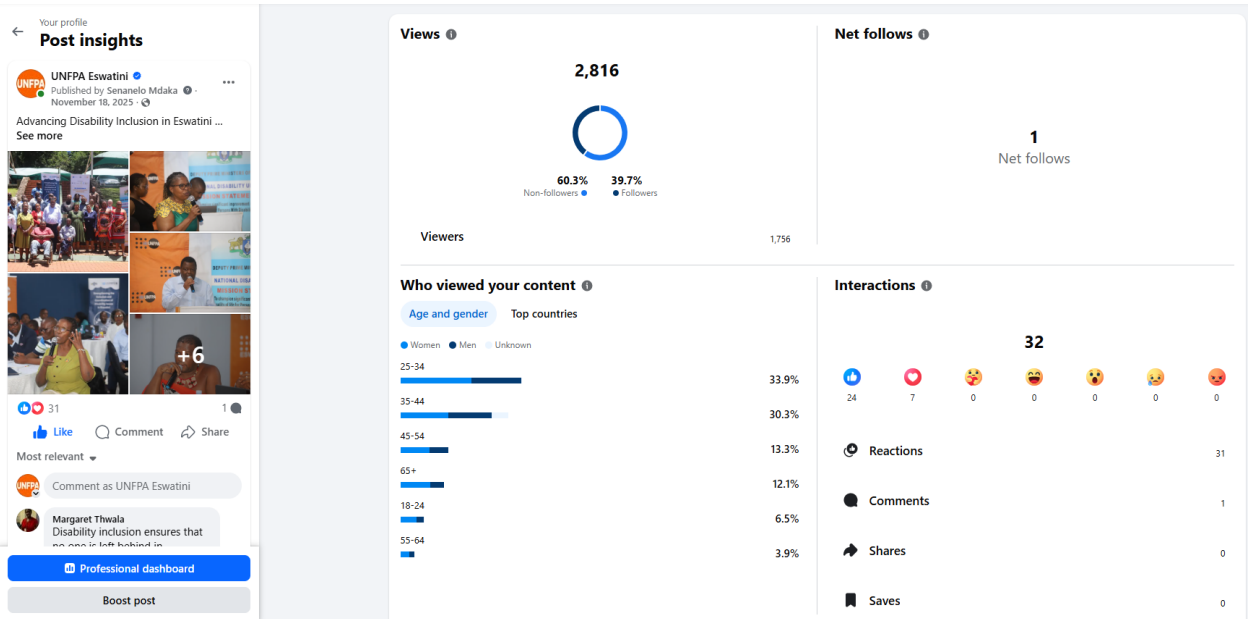

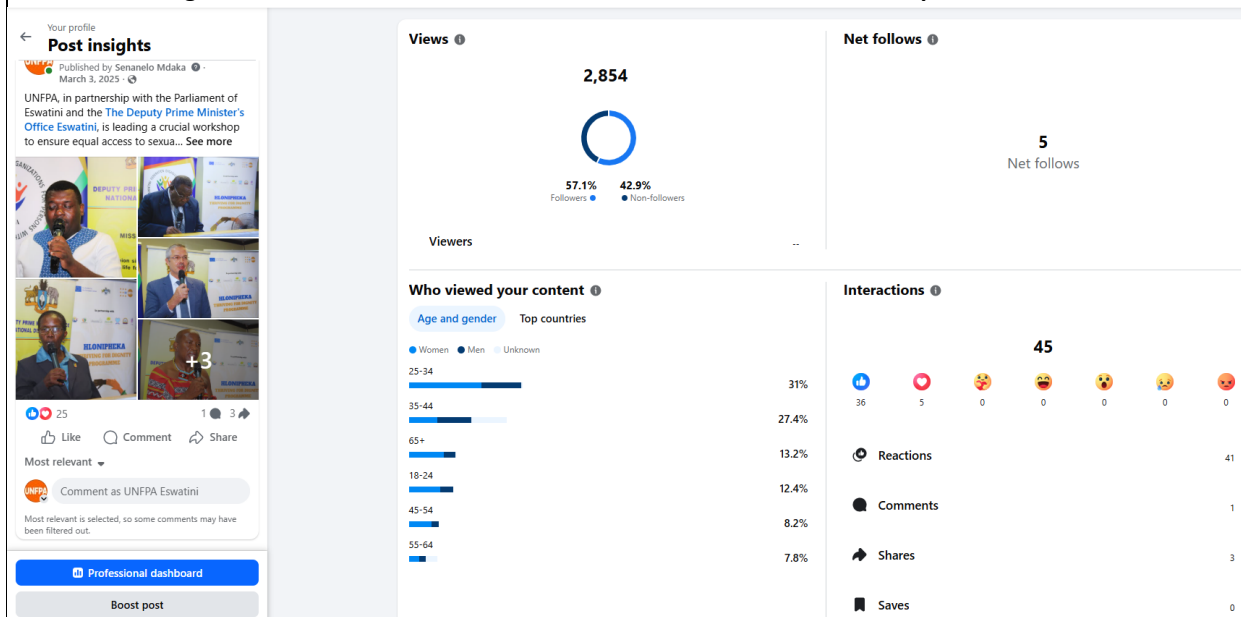

## 9. Challenges

Please describe any major challenges that arose during the programme implementation and how this affected the programme implementation.

1. While awareness was created about disability-inclusive practices, many of these shifts were not fully entrenched within government systems. The main stakeholders such as the Ministry of Finance were constantly busy therefore coverage was not as the program desired .
2. While the programme successfully catalyzed important reforms, the availability of funding and technical resources was not sufficient to expand interventions at scale, particularly in areas such as disability-inclusive budgeting and service delivery models. As a result, coverage remained limited and highly dependent on budget constraints.
3. Lack of a digital monitoring system or dashboard where the different Ministries can send reports on the progress done.
4. Whilst the project achieved milestones on disability indicator inclusion in national data systems (HMIS and EMIS), linking the two systems remains a gap that the government needs to take forward.
5. The project identified capacity gaps on disability screening among health care workers that require sustained training efforts.
6. The project identified gaps in referral mechanisms and coordination for children identified with disabilities following disability screening.

Please could you share what action you took to address identified challenges?

1. Continue advocacy with the government through the Disability Advisory Council and Secretariat for fully entrenched disability systems.
2. Continuous resource mobilization for expansion of programmes
3. Engage the Ministry of Information, Communication and Technology on digital systems for disability reporting
4. The training of the EMIS and HMIS officers provided the necessary skills to pursue the linkages of the two systems. To engage the Ministry of Information, Communication and Technology on linking the systems
5. Engage the Ministry of Health to roll-out disability screening for early detection and further strengthen the capacity of health care workers
6. Engage the Ministry of Health to strengthen its disability referral pathways to effectively assist children requiring further assessment and assistance and to systematically integrate a disability programme with linkages to the social welfare department.

## 10. Project Sustainability

Please provide an overview of initiatives planned by various stakeholders in order to follow up on activities initiated by the programme.

1. Through advocacy of the programme, the DPMO has been successful in establishing the Secretariat as recruitment for the Director and Registrar is ongoing. This will play a great role in the sustainability of the activities initiated by the programme and further strengthening disability inclusion especially in government ministries.
2. For sustainability of gains made in operationalization of the National Disability Plan of Action, the Deputy Prime Minister's Office continues to follow up and raise awareness on the Costed Plan as resource mobilization for disability financing is a priority to sustain gains made by the Round 4 Programme.
3. The Ministry of Health will incorporate the validated disability screening tools in the CMIS at health facilities, communities and school health, forming routine data collection henceforth. Similarly, the Ministry of Education will incorporate the validated disability screening tools in EMIS for routine education sector data collection.
4. The broader Eswatini Government plan is to ensure data systems are digitised and PIN driven to enable interoperability and linkages. Therefore EMIS and CMIS now have the capacity to pursue these linkages.
5. The UN through the programme has been able to strengthen disability inclusion in its operations and programming. As a result it has established a disability coordinating mechanism platform for UN agencies. This will continue to be implemented through the new UNSDCF 2026-2030.

Please outline how the medium-to-long term sustainability of the work initiated by the project will be ensured after the end of the Project.

1. The existence of the Costed Eswatini National Disability Plan Action (2024-208) provides a national roadmap for mainstreaming disability rights in program planning, implementation, monitoring and reporting.
2. Because the project strengthened the capacity of existing government institutions to mainstream disability inclusion, e.g., EMIS and HMIS, sustainability is assured after project end.
3. Continuous support for the established coordination mechanism in government, national and UN.
4. Expansion and strengthening of the disability screening.

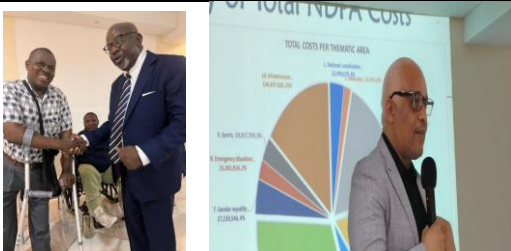
