- 177 health care personnel trained on cholera case management, proper management of patient register, and on the revised case definition of suspected cholera cases, including 32 in the North, 55 in the Center, 30 in South, 30 in Grand'Anse and 30 in South-East
- Supervision visits to 17 CTDA, including:
  - 11 in Artibonite CTDA (Providence Hospital in Gonaives, Albert Schweitzer de Deschapelles, Dumarsais Estimé Hospital in Verrettes, L'Estère Hospital, Toussaint Louverture Hospital in Ennery, St Nicolas in St. Marc, Drouin in Grande Saline, Alma Mater Hospital in Gros Morne, St Michel de l'Attalaye, St Pierre in Desdunes, Bois Mary in Marchand Dessalines)
  - 6 in the Center (Hinche, Maissade, Thomonde, Mirebalais, Lascahobas, Cerca la Source)
- Rehabilitation works conducted in 7 CTDA, including:
  - Rehabilitation works in Ennery CTDA in Artibonite, including bathrooms, footbaths, and a dejection pit.
  - Rehabilitation works in Wesleyenne CTDA in West, in Anse-à-Galets (La Gonâve), including rehabilitation of showers, footbaths, and latrines.
  - Rehabilitation works to 2 CTDAs in Center including a dejection pit, repairs to the roof (Hinche), and a dejection pit, a shelter for visitors (Maissade).
  - Rehabilitation works in 2 CTDAs in South, including footbaths and handwashing stations, separation screens (Cavaillon and Les Anglais), and a dejection pit and a shelter for visitors (Les Anglais).
  - Integration and rehabilitation works in Saint Michel Hospital in Jacmel in South-east, including construction of bathrooms, footbaths, a dejection pit, a utility room and a shelter for visitors.
- Onsite training of 24 CTDA personnel: 11 in Artibonite (1 doctor in Drouin de Grande Saline; 5 nurses (L'Estère, Gonaïves, Grande Saline, Verrettes and St Marc); and 5 hygienists (2 in St Marc, and one each in L'Estère, HPG, and Verrettes) and 13 in Center department (3 doctors, 4 nurses and 6 auxiliary nurses) on cholera case management, proper management of patient register, and IPC norms in Hinche, Maissade, Thomonde, Mirebalais, Lascahobas, Cerca la Source CTDAs.
- As part of the agreement signed with the French Red Cross, the following activities were undertaken :
  - Provision of human resources in 3 cholera treatment centers: 2 in Artibonite department: Providence de Gonaives, St. Michel de l'Attalaye and 1 in the West department: CTDA of Corail.
  - 3 supervision nurses were provided for the Artibonite department to ensure the supervision of CTDAs with patients

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• Rehabilitations of 9 CTDAs in the following departments: 3 in the North-West 4 in Artibonite, 1 in the West and 1 in the Center

- Between epidemiological week 10 and 13 of 2018, a total of 7 cholera alerts were notified in the communes of Croix-des-Bouquets (4) and Cabaret (2) in the West department, and in Anse-à-Foleur (1) in the North West department. Furthermore, PAHO supported the Investigation Committee for the West department (CIDO) to investigate the outbreak in Croix-des-Bouquets, where more than half of the alerts were notified.
- PAHO worked jointly with MSPP on institutional response as well as on investigations of cholera cases and outbreaks. PAHO's support mainly focused on outbreak investigations in West, Centre and Artibonite where most of the suspected cases of cholera are concentrated. The low cholera activity during this period allowed responding to all the detected alerts and events. Close coordination with the departmental health unit and the central level was maintained for the monitoring of the epidemiological situation nationwide.
- In March, PAHO supported the MSPP in training trainers on the new epidemiological surveillance tools (acute diarrhea registry) and the new cholera case definitions in all 10 departments. Additionally, supervision visits of CTDAs were undertaken in Artibonite, Center, Nord-West, North, North-East, South, South-East and Grand'Anse departments. Support was provided to the health directorate of Grand'Anse to update the cholera line list.
- Five epidemiologists are currently deployed to support Departmental Health Directorates in Center, Artibonite, West, South and Grande Anse departments to support the investigation of infectious diseases and epidemiological surveillance. Their support also focuses on the improvement of cholera diagnosis in cholera treatment centers (CTCs/CTDAs) through in situ training and regular follow-up. PAHO supported and accompanied the MSPP on an audit and training mission on epidemiological surveillance tools in the Centre department.
- The "labo-moto" nurses, who began working in December, continue to support to improve the sampling rate among suspected cases (objective of 100% in 2018) with regular visits to CTDAs and the transport of Cary Blair (cholera samples) from institutions to laboratories in the West, Artibonite and Centre departments. In March, the nurses made 85 visits to 37 CTDAs. 216 Cary Blairs were transported to laboratories and the sampling rate is 78%.
- PAHO supported the planning of the cholera vaccination campaign, set to take place in April, in response to the ongoing outbreak in the commune of Saint Michel de l'Attalaye in the Center department.
