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#### **NARRATIVE**

**Situation Update** (please describe critical changes, if any, in the situation that affect the project (1-2 paragraphs)

On 29 December 2015, the World Health organization (WHO) declared the end of Ebola virus transmission in Guinea after 42 days had passed since the last confirmed case tested negative for the second time. Since then, Guinea has entered a 90-day period of heightened surveillance to ensure rapid identification of any new cases. All key partners, including UNICEF are now reenergizing their support to the country in its efforts towards a stronger and more resilient health and community systems. Full implementation of the health sector recovery agenda has shed the light on the critical importance of the ongoing construction of the 6 epidemiologic centers.

For the construction of 6 epidemiologic centers, the following points have to be highlighted:

According on the construction contracts, the duration of construction period is 5 months. The 6 centers are expected to be completed in May 2017. During construction period the payments will be done following the work progress, including the payment after completion of works

After the completion of work, the 1 year guarantee period will start. A final payment (10% of total amount) will be paid at the end of guarantee period (around may 2017). Previous retention money amount is 345,329 USD.
