Output 2 (Parliament Strategic Plan Objective 3): NFP, Somaliland Parliament and House of Representatives of the regional states established as an effective institution, with a functioning administration and infrastructure and leadership supported to discharge their constitutional mandates to fairly, inclusively and transparently manage the business of Parliament and lead the Parliamentary Administration

Output 3 (Parliament Strategic Plan Objective 2): MPs are empowered to represent and remain accountable to the Somali people and to provide leadership in a way that promotes national unity for Somalis, including young people and women, participative & representative democracy and more effective contribution to political decision-making.

Revision Justification

The Parliamentary Support Programme, under the guidance of the NFP leadership and support from the Donors, has continuously supported this transition from 9th to the 10th Parliament through provision of technical advisory and logistical support to ensure smooth and timely transition these efforts that resulted in the establishment of the 10th Parliament, election of the Speakers of the two houses as well as the presidential elections.

The UNDP programme, in the medium term, will provide the required support to assist the harmonization of the work between the two houses through provision of the technical advisory services notably to revise and develop the Rules of Procedures of the two houses. Support will also be extended to develop the NFP Strategic Action Plan which will result in the formation of the Upper House, the House of the People Committees as well as the joint committees. Upon the completion of this task an induction training will be organized to enhance and advance the understanding of the newly elected MPs on their constitutional functions. Simultaneously, the project continues to provide support to Puntland, Somaliland, State Assemblies of Jubaland, South West, Galmudug and also to the newly established State Assembly in HirShabelle and the newly formed Forum of Speakers of the legislative bodies.

The Programme Board meeting held on 4 Apr 2017, co-chaired by Honourable Speaker Jawari and UNDP Country Director George Conway was well attended by Donors' representatives. Since the transition required immediate as well as medium-term support, and to ensure an uninterrupted continuity of the technical and operational support, at federal and state level, it is crucial to extend the project for three months (Apr to Jun 2017).

The Project board meeting approved three month project extension from 01 Apr to 30 Jun 2017 to ensure that the national transition is continuously supported. The additional three months will provide a window of opportunity to finalize the NFP 4-years strategic action-plan, align phase II of the UNDP project document to the National Parliament Strategy, as well as those of the State Assemblies. The total Budget including the additional funds required for extension of three months reflects the increase of total project budget from USD 15,827,041 to USD 16,617,286 with increase of USD 790,245 which is 5% addition to the previously approved budget.
