- The Community Assistance Project in the 5 communities of Mirebalais were completed.
- The project in the community of Grand Boucan was completed. Following the construction of the water collection system, a supplier was hired to install the water treatment system.
- The project team continues to maintain remote follow-ups through field visits with all the water supply system management committees and members of the platforms to ensure the proper functioning of all the systems.

Delays or Deviations (if any, briefly describe the delays or changes in focus, approach or targets, and provide a short justification for the change in <u>1-2 narrative paragraphs</u>).

- The socio-political instability in 2019 as well as the restrictions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic have had a considerable impact in the implementation of activities. Significant delays were experienced in the construction phases and required an extension of the project.
- The activity schedule was adjusted regularly to ameliorate the delays and to meet the expected end date of the project.
- To date all the project activities are finalized. The project team still maintains contact with the different platforms to ensure follow-up in order to verify and confirm all the project achievements.

Although all selected projects were completed with significant delays justifiably, the beneficiaries are satisfied with the quality of the work carried out. On the other hand, they are concerned that their highest priority needs have not been realized because of budget constraints. The beneficiaries hope for advocacy with the United Nations to increase the size of the budgets allotted to them to allow them to carry out larger scale projects that meet their most important priorities.
