ANNUAL HIGHLIGHTS:

- 1. The Joint Rule of Law Programme for Somaliland commenced implementation following a first Programme Steering Committee meeting in June 2020, during which the 2020 Annual Workplan received approval.
- 2. Access to justice services for the people of Somaliland, particularly women and vulnerable groups, was enhanced through expansion of regional mobile courts to 8 Districts, one stop SGBV centers in Hargeisa and two regions, legal aid coordination, legal aid services in regions through legal aid clinics, specialized women and children units in six regions. Mobile courts provided services for 1,619 beneficiaries (F:368, M:1,233, Children:18) and legal aid was provided to 2,073 beneficiaries, (F:829, M:1,153, Children:91). Following a series of consultative workshops connecting the formal and informal institutions which supply justice in Somaliland, recommendations were made on the establishment of ADR centers in all regions of Somaliland, operating under the oversight of Ministry of Justice of Somaliland.
- 3. The capacity of a broad range of institution staff from justice, policing and security sectors was developed through a variety of capacity building trainings, awareness workshops and sub-working groups meetings, with 992 total participants (M:741, F:251). Training topics included community partnership policing, human rights, due process, child sensitive and gender responsive policing.
- 4. Capacity to support SGBV survivors was enhanced through the three SGBV support centers, which provided free services such as medical assistance, prevention of HIV and pregnancy, psychosocial counseling, legal aid and prosecution support for 272 beneficiaries (F:251, M:21) during the reporting period.

HIGHLIGHTS OF KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

During the reporting period, the Joint RoL Programme for Somaliland reinforced the Government of Somaliland to improve its rule of law services through: strengthening the judiciary and improving accountability through court inspections; enlarging access to the formal and inform legal system through provision of mobile courts, understanding informal dispute resolutions arrangements and linkages with the formal justice system, expansion and coordination of legal aid services to two regions; bringing all justice, human rights, rule of law and security actors and civil society on one platform to discuss and highlight progress, challenges and concerns, and providing capacity building training for staff of various RoL institutions.

Access to justice in Somaliland is expanded through the provision of mobile courts, legal aid services enhancing the rights of vulnerable and disadvantaged groups. Traditional dispute resolution is better understood, harmonized, and linked with the formal court system informed by human rights and gender equality principles.

Police capacity in human rights, SGBV and child rights was developed through trainings, greater police accountability and oversight is being strengthened through the community policing initiatives with buy-in from local communities and informed by international and constitutional norms.

Coordination of Rule of Law was enhanced through the establishment and support of sub-working groups for Human Rights, Security and Juvenile justice, in line with the framework of the Governance Pillar of NDP-II and composed of government institutions, civil society, NGOs and international stakeholders. This strengthened the interlinkage of the sector wide rule of law and security programme based on NDPII and MOI prioritization plan.

Following a training needs assessment by the Somaliland Judicial Commission, training manuals are being developed, while AGO delivered two training following the training need assessment. A judicial inspection and monitoring scheme also handled complaints and enhanced the effectiveness and efficiency of judicial personnel and quality of service delivery.

Access to training for Somaliland Custodial Corps has been improved through the provision of tailored training material and the establishment of a Development Managers Programme, agreed by the Ministry of Justice and Somaliland Custodial Corps. 13 male and 2 female offices were identified to attend trainings in Q1 2021.

A Prison Feasibility Study was drafted based on interviews conducted with prison officers and prisoners, and support from the Ministry of Justice and Somaliland Custodial Corps. The consultation meeting with the national counterparts will be arranged in 2021.

SITUATION UPDATE

The Joint Rule of Law Programme for Somaliland commenced implementation following a first Programme Steering Committee meeting on 22 June 2020 that approved the Prioritization Plan and the 2020 Annual Workplan. The programme is implemented in partnership with the Ministry of Interior, Ministry of Justice, Ministry of Health/ Hargeisa Group of Hospitals, the Attorney General's Office, the Supreme Court, the Police Commissioner, the Custodial Corps, the Somaliland Human Rights Commission and the Universities of Hargeisa, Burao and Amoud.

Somaliland remained relatively peaceful and stable during the reporting period, particularly in comparison to the insecurity experienced by other regions of Somalia. The upcoming parliamentary and local government elections in Somaliland pose a potential security risk, but the programme will conduct activities to support election security. Somaliland political actors and parties are in agreement to participate and organize for the forthcoming elections of



the local government and parliament that will be held on 31st May 2021, as declared by the Somaliland National Election Commission.

NARRATIVE

Output 1: Rights-respecting and accountable basic justice services increased in piloted areas

1. The Capacity of the Ministry of justice strengthened

The capacity of the Ministry of Justice was strengthened through integrating and linking traditional dispute resolution with the formal justice system, standardizing and establishing a national uniform legislative drafting process, finalizing the overall strategic plan of the Ministry of Justice, supporting the finalization of the legal aid bill, and enhancing the availability of legal aid services at the prisons, monitoring human rights of prisoners and enhancing coordination among justice stakeholders.

2. Legal Drafting

The Ministry of Justice organized a national consultative workshop on the legislative drafting process in Hargeisa on 02-05 October 2020. The workshop was attended by experts from justice sector, human rights advocacy, independent lawyers, legal drafting experts from the Ministry of Justice, Attorney General's Office, Solicitor General, Courts, Ministry of Constitutional Affairs and Parliamentary Relations, Law Reform Commissions, Somaliland Lawyer Association (SOLLA), Somaliland Women's Lawyer Association (SWLA), Women in Law Initiative (WLI), Peace and Strategic Policy Center, CSOs and Lawyers as the key stakeholders of the national legal drafting process. The legal drafting consultative workshop, resulted in participants gaining a clear understanding of the rights-based legal drafting process and receiving training in legal drafting process techniques for public institutions, particularly justice sector institutions, for developing inclusive and rights based Rule of Law policies and legislation.

3. ADR/TDR

The programme supported the communal relationships between the formal and informal institutions which supply justice in Somaliland, in order to expand access to justice for the population. Three different ADR/TDR consultation workshops were organized by the Ministry of Justice and held in Hargeisa, Borama and Berbera, enabling participants to better understand traditional dispute resolution and how it can be harmonized and linked with the formal court system informed by human rights and gender equality principles. Workshop participants included key justice institutions, including the Ministry of Justice, Attorney General's Office, Ministry of Interior Affairs, the Solicitor General, the Somaliland Human Rights Commission and the courts. Traditional leaders and/or religious leaders were also represented. The three ADR/TDR workshops enhanced the capacity of customary law actors and led to an agreement on the establishment of ADR centers in all regions of Somaliland and the establishment of ADR committees operating under the administration of Ministry of Justice of Somaliland.

4. Legal Aid

2,073 beneficiaries (F:829, M:1,153, Child:91) received free legal aid from Hargeisa university, Amoud university and Burao University, enabling access to justice for those that would otherwise not be able to afford legal representation. Particularly benefitting were vulnerable social groups including women, children and minority groups.



5. SGBV

Programme support for three SGBV Baahikoob centers, under the three regional Hospitals of Hargeisa group Hospital, Borama Regional Hospital, and Burao Regional Hospital, increased access to medical services, prevention of HIV and pregnancy, psychosocial counseling, legal aid and prosecution support for the survivors of SGBV. The centres handled a total of 272 cases (F:251, M:21) during the reporting period.

6. Awareness

A Community Awareness programme was implemented through training sessions and media outreach by legal aid providers, SGBV Baahikoob Centers Community Policing and ADR/TDR workshops for the traditional Elders. Approximately 15,000 were reached the awareness programme, of which 40% were female, 50% Male and 10% Children.

7. Mobile Courts

The programme provided support the expansion of mobile court services to increase access to justice for residents of rural areas, reaching 45 districts including new 8 districts of Somaliland. During the reporting period, Somaliland mobile courts adjudicated a total of 305 cases, representing 1,619 beneficiaries (F:368, M:1,233, Children:18).

8. Judicial inspection and monitoring scheme

The effectiveness and efficiency of the judicial personnel and quality of service delivery by the Somaliland Courts was enhanced through the programme's support for a judicial inspection and monitoring scheme. The judicial inspection teams visited district, regional and appeal courts in Hargeisa, Burao, Borama, Ainabo and Lasanod and during the reporting period received a total of 103 complaints. 56 of these complaints were solved though the provision of legal and professional advice, 42 cases were processed by the Judicial Commission and 5 cases are under investigation.

9. Capacities of judges and lawyers are enhanced

Judicial training was provided by the programme to ensure high standards of competence and performance in the judiciary, in order to enhance the protection of the rights of the population. The Somaliland Judicial Commission (JC) implemented a Training Needs Assessment (TNA) Workshop on 21-22 November 2020. Recommendations from the workshop identified training priorities including for new staff, case management, administration and office work management, case writing and filing system, Islamic sharia (family and Ijtihad), leadership, ICT, procedural code, report writing and conflict resolution.

UN Women completed the selection process for a CSO to implement trainings, increase the legal empowerments of women, conduct advocacy of the women's rights bills including the Sexual Offences Bill and legal aid services, and build the capacity of women associations in Somaliland to contribute to the capacity building and advocacy on gendered legislation. The Somaliland Women Lawyers Association (SWLA) was selected to undertake and implement the activity and train women on legal aid and advices services, reporting procedures, advocacy of SOB, leadership, and provision of the legal texts relating to the legal empowerment and women's access to justice. The activities were planned for implementation during 2020, however, due to the competitive selection process, activities were delayed until 2021.



10. AGO and Women and child Units

The capacity of the Attorney General's Office and prosecutors enhanced in the areas of SGBV and juvenile justice, with a specific focus on children's cases e.g. children in conflict with the law. Regular monitoring of detainees and visits to police stations and prisons were conducted by the AGO regional Offices and reported to HQ in Hargeisa. On 20-22 Oct. 2020 a training workshop on Juvenile Justice and SGBV was organized by the AGO. Greater numbers of female prosecutors in service were encouraged by the AGO to provide more support to female victims of SGBV.

11. Monitoring Human rights and Prisons

Somaliland National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) was supported by the programme to effectively monitor detainees and prisoners for protection of their basic rights. A training workshop to review the monitoring tools for detention centres was conducted on 20-21 Oct. 2020 with 30 (F: 6, M: 24) participants from the NHRC, who were also provided with capacity building training on appropriate utilization of the monitoring tools. A further training workshop for judges and prosecutors on free press and media freedom rights with 40 participants was conducted on 28-29 Dec. 2020 in Hargeisa,.

A consultation workshop on legal gaps and criminalization of media cases was also organized in Burao on 30-31 Dec. 2020, to support the NHRC to effectively lead social dialogue on freedom of expression, media and training on due process and human rights for police and journalists. This was accompanied by the publication of NHRC's Annual Report 2020 and translation into local language for greater awareness of human rights.

12. Awareness on Disability Rights

Public awareness on the rights of people with disabilities was supported through the Line Ministry of Employment, Social Affairs and Family, which in cooperation with Disabled Persons' organizations, organized a celebration of the international day for disabled persons on 3rd Dec. 2020. The programme will further contribute to the improvement of disability rights by supporting the development of legislation to implement the National Disability Policy 2021.

13. Scholarships

Scholarships for 20 students (F:10, M:10) from the staff of the different justice actors such Ministry of Justice, Judiciary, Attorney General's Office and Solicitor General's office were supported by the programme to enable them to study in Hargeisa University's Post-Graduate School for the 2020-2021 term.

14. Review of Law Degree Curriculum for LLB and LLM Programmes of the University of Hargeisa

A comprehensive review of the College of Law Curriculum for LLB and LLM Programmes of the University of Hargeisa was conducted by a local consultant. The consultant was hired to review the university curriculum for law graduation and to conduct in-depth analysis of the existing course structures. The consultant provided an update on the current contents of each course and recommended new reading materials for each course.



15. Trainings:

- Hargeisa University's Legal Aid Clinic organized a two-day Legal Aid Awareness and Training workshop on 29– 30 November 2020 held at Imperial Hotel, Hargeisa, Somaliland. This high-level awareness raising Training aimed at widening the awareness on legal aid services as well as the improvement of the quantity and quality of legal aid and Somaliland Criminal Justice System, and promoted the UN principles and guidelines on access to legal aid.
- Training workshop on Legal Aid and Community Awareness organized on 17-18 Nov.2020 by Burao University Legal Aid Clinic for improving community awareness on availability and contacts of free legal aid services in Burao Togdheer region.
- Training workshop on Legal Aid and Community Awareness conducted by Amoud university Legal Aid Clinic on 10-11 November 2020 with 30 participants (F:10, M:20) for improving community awareness on availability and contacts of free legal aid services in Amoud University Borama Awdal region
- Training and Awareness workshop on strengthening coordination and referral mechanisms for SGBV cases, organized by Burao Regional Hospital / Baahikoob Center, was held on 09-10 Dec.2020 with 30 participants (F:12, M:18). The workshop enabled the attendees, including the Burao police, prosecutors, traditional leaders, civil society, and IDP committees, to better understand the harmful impacts of violence against women, particularly rape and domestic violence, and how this violence can be tackled through the proper legal systems if women's access is improved.
- Training and Awareness workshop on strengthening coordination and referral mechanisms for SGBV cases, organized by Hargeisa Group Hospital Baahikoob Center, was held on 10-11 Dec. 2020 with 32 participants (F:9, M:23). The workshop enhanced communities' awareness of the availability and contacts for SGBV victim support services.
- Training and Awareness workshop on strengthening coordination and referral mechanisms for SGBV cases was organized by Borama Regional Hospital / Baahikoob Center with 44 participants (F:12, M:32), focusing on improving women's access to the judiciary and community awareness on SGBV victim support services in the region
- Training workshop was organized by Hargeisa Group Hospital (HGH)/Baahikoob Center for staff on collection of evidence, medico-legal issues and the investigation of SGBV cases, with 39 participants (F:17, M:22).

Output 2: Rights-respecting and accountable basic policing services increased in piloted areas

- Community Policing initiatives were established in two police stations in Hargeisa during the reporting period, to better engage the community in policing efforts, increase civilian oversight and encourage information sharing. Community and police members received training on effective community policing in a workshop on 10-12 Nov 2020, with 37 Police and Community members (F:15, M:22) participating.
- A further training workshop for the establishment and empowerment of Community Policing committee and Police Officers in the Mohamed Mooge Sub-district police station was conducted in Hargeisa on 14-16 Nov. 2020. The workshop focused on community policing methods and practice for the attendees.



- A Human Rights training Workshop was organized on 22 23 Nov. 2020 at the Police Academy for empowering Somaliland Police Officers in promoting rights based, gender responsive and child sensitive police/community partnerships in community security and justice structures. 42 Police Officers (F:12, M:30) actively participated.
- Supported the Training Needs Assessment (TNA) that contributes to strengthening police capacity for respect of human rights, SGBV and child rights.
- The programme facilitated the dissemination of 2000 copies of Somaliland Police Act to all police stations in Somaliland, along with targeted community members .
- To improve police accountability, a Police Complaint Mechanism was developed following a consultation workshop conducted on 2-3 Dec. 2020 at the Police academy in Hargeisa. Participants, including senior police experts and the head of police department, discussed sustainable improvements to rights-respecting police oversight, accountability and police/public community partnerships, informed by international and constitutional norms.

Output 3: Parole and probation services to help the sustainable management of scarce corrections facilities developed and piloted

- UNODC commenced consultation and engagement with the Ministry of Justice on the establishment of a cooperation framework for a pilot parole system, aiming to strengthen the access to the community outside of Hargeisa.
- With the support of the Ministry of Justice and Somaliland Custodial Corps, interviews with 25 prisoners and prison staff were conducted for the Prison Feasibility Study. Based on this assessment, the draft of the report was developed and prepared for the consultation in 2021.
- Since the COVID-19 pandemic affected presence on the ground, the UNODC Prison mentors continued their close collaboration with Somaliland Custodial Corps through developing the training programme and materials for the Developing Managers Programme (DMP), which were finalised in December 2021. The 15 participants, selected through the recommendation from the national counterparts, will join the DMP from January 2021.
- The implementation plan and training materials for the Senior Management Programme were developed. The programme will be commenced in the latter half of 2021.

Output 4: Security Sector Governance enhanced

NDP II and Security and Rule of law

Notwithstanding a temporary JROLP Budgetary freeze in late 2019 to early 2020 and subsequent re-prioritization to COVID related programs in much of 2020, the budget and significance of the Somaliland Threat Assessment (SLTA) was re-affirmed by the Government of Somaliland in the Context of the June 2020 Prioritization Plan. The SLTA Concept Note was presented to the NDPII Security Sub Working Group and the Governance Sector Forum on 26 and 28 October 2020 respectively and was endorsed by the Minister of the Interior on 4 November 2020. Subsequently the UNSOM-UNDP Integrated SSR Section has been working on a draft outline of the SLTA for



consideration by the MOI and concerned line Ministries, and TOR's for dedicated consultants have been drafted. Multiple constructive discussions have been held with the MOI concerning the way forward in early 2021 despite the challenges posed by the impending electoral calendar.

Development of a credible Somaliland Threat Assessment (SLTA) is an agreed objective under the Governance Forum structure of the Somaliland National Development Plan II and a key contribution under the framework of Sustainable Development Goals (notably SDG 16 Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions). It will be an important step in support of preparatory risk/threat contingency planning and public accountability, noting that its development will be inclusive, involving all Governance Forum stakeholders and many other NDP II actors, and will provide 'capstone' guidance in order to guide Ministerial plans.

Output 5: Co-ordination of the rule of law and security sectors improved

Through the coordination and leadership of the Ministry of Interior of Somaliland, the programme has supported the development of Comprehensive rule of law and security framework of the Governance Pillar of NDP-II and its related Sub-sector working groups. The NDPII Security Sub-Working Group met on 26 Oct. 2020 in Hargeisa, while the NDPII Rule of Law and human rights Sub- Working Group met on 22 Sept. 2020 with 30 participants including lawyers, representatives from the Human Right Commission, AGO, Courts, CSOs UN and International Agencies working in the rule of law and human rights sector in Somaliland. Also supported was the NDPII Governance Pillar Quarterly Forum, attended by the Government Agencies, NGOs and international stakeholders conducted on 28 Oct. 2020 in Hargeisa.

A Children Thematic Working Group meeting was held on 10 November 2020 to discuss solutions to the situation of children in conflict with the law, conducted a review of children in detentions and police stations facilities, and review the assessments compiled in the September 2020 monitoring report.

Other Key Achievements

Support was provided for institutional capacity building for the national partners: Pre-HACT training was conducted for the preparation of institutional micro-assessments for the Attorney General's Office, Hargeisa Group Hospital, National Human Rights Commission and Burao University. 19 Staff members (F:8, M:11) participated in a virtual Training on 14-16 August 2020.

COVID-19 response

 The programme supported a public Awareness and Training on prevention of COVID-19 and provided handwashing and cleaning materials for police stations in Somaliland. Messaging on the prevention of Covid-19 pandemic was disseminated through media programs on TV and radio and through billboards. Additionally, awareness raising workshops were provided for police stations and prison populations in Somaliland.





Challenges (incl: Delays or Deviations) and Lessons Learnt:

- COVID-19 posed the most significant challenge to the programme implementation and monitoring, as social distancing prevented in-person monitoring and forced the postponement of some events/trainings organized by implementing partners during the reporting.
- Initial coordination difficulties between the participating UN Organizations (PUNOs) in the programme presented a challenge, and so improvements to communication and coordination in this area are a priority for 2021. Additionally, limited capacity of the national implementing partners in implementation and reporting is an anticipated hurdle that will require training to improve.

Gender

The joint ROL programme continued to prioritize the increase of women into the legal profession. Promoting and mainstreaming gender issues in all interventions is a high priority for the Somaliland programme. Women and girls are a significant portion of the beneficiaries of legal aid and scholarships, and the SGBV centres predominately assist women as survivors of SGBV, with 251 supported during the reporting period.

Human Rights

The programme has prioritised the promotion and protection of human rights through support to National Human Rights Commission for monitoring and reporting on detainees' and prisoners' basic rights. The NHRC has also led social dialogue on freedom of expression and free media, and provided training on due process and human rights for police and journalists. The provision of free legal aid and medical services for the SGBV through Baahikoob Centers under the regional Hospitals also helps to reinforce the human rights of citizens, particularly vulnerable groups.
