Narrative Summary

Proposal on the Development of Standard Operating Procedures to address Gender Based Violence in Humanitarian Settings

Overview

A major factor in crimes of sexual violence during conflict worldwide, is widespread impunity. In the context of the Bosnian conflict this is particularly acute, despite the work of the ICTY and the national courts. There are many contributing factors: the focus by courts on the conduct of the woman, which alienates those who would otherwise come forward; the failure of law to accurately reflect their experience of sexual violence; the lack of effective protection; and in more general terms, the result of a failure of policies to provide social and economic rights, vital if women are to have the ability to participate in formal justice mechanisms.

Through meetings and briefings from women and women's organizations from the region, and also with government and representatives of UN agencies, the EU and OSCE, the SRSG will be able to gain valuable insight into post conflict accountability mechanisms and the importance of policies and budgets which address the social position of women as a factor in determining whether women can particapate in formal justice. This information can inform her country-level, regional and international advocacy and will also help galvanize the women's movement and UN programming in the region.

The overall objective will be to draw attention to the continued marginalization of women survivors of sexual violence in the region and the absence of real justice for women. There may be a series of follow up activities to address the findings and outcome of the consultations.

Compliance with UN Action's Strategic Framework

This project contributes to the intensification of advocacy efforts as outlined under Pillar A of the 2009-10 UN Action Strategic Framework, "Support to UN System-Wide Action at Country Level," by providing a platform for women's voices in the Women, Peace and Security arena. Consultations with women of the Balkans will inform the SRSG advocacy and programming in the region and in that sense also increases knowledge available on the region.





Methodology:

UNFPA will collaborate with WIPLF to support organization of meetings with women's NGOs and with government, EU, OSCE and the UNCT in Bosnia.

- 1. Identify a consultant to draft a background document on laws and processes regarding the prosecution of rape in the region by 12 November 2010. This should include the recommendations of Treaty Bodies and the status of implementation. Draft an outcome document with the recommendations made during the meetings, both for government, UN, EU and other actors, with timelines for their implementation.
- 2. Identify participants from representatives of government, civil society, UN and international community, approximately 20, and arrange a half day interactive dialogue on the current obstacles to women participating in accountability mechanisms. Discussions will include the extent to which recommendations of Treaty Bodies on these issues have been implemented and steps that need to be taken. This should be linked to and included in the ongoing constitutional reform process.
- 3. Organise a programme for a two-day consultation by the SRSG with relevant bodies to include: bilateral meetings with government, UN other representatives of the international community, and NGO's.
- 4. Follow up to the mission is anticipated and a budget is set aside for research, consultancies and technical support that may be identified by the SRSG during her mission and discussions with women's NGOs, the UN and government.

Some of the follow up that has been discussed prior to the mission includes providing technical support on issues around justice and constitutional/legal reform. For example, with the constitution reform process, technical input may be required to ensure issues related to SV are reflected. Follow up might also include support for drilling down from national to cantonal government structures to ensure that issues and processes discussed at the national level support change close to women's lives. This might require additional research or exchange at the sub-national level.

Participant Selection:

Government representatives from B-H, women's NGOs from the region (Bosnia, Serbia, Kosovo and Croatia) UN agencies, OSCE, EU including peacekeeping mission.

Project Outputs and Monitoring:

Analyse the normative framework to ensure it is reflective of jurisprudential interpretation re the prosecution of rape.

A report will be developed at the end of the series of meeting which will be used as a basis for this work.

Intended Impact:





- Define sexual violence in the context of the Balkans which incorporates the sexual violence committed in the course of conflict and post conflict. Including rape sexual slavery and trafficking.
- Strengthen the accountability mechanisms to secure protection and justice for victims/survivor
- Provide technical assistance as identified through the consultation process
