Preparatory activities with implementing partners have been concluded following the approval of the joint agency workplan by the project steering committee. Implementation of project activities is progressing smoothly and activities on schedule for the year are expected to be completed as planned. A major event was registered on 24 May, when all 29 TRRC recommendations in SGBV were accepted by the Government in its White Paper on the TRRC Final Report. The Minister of Justice's address during the event highlighted the worrisome status of SGBV, noted its persistence, called for a whole of society approach and support from all partners. Specific project progress registered so far includes the provision of MHPSS services to TRRC SGBV survivors of SGBV through community healing circles and capacity building for doctors, social and health workers. There are also various ongoing livelihood and empowerment training for vulnerable women, again including TRRC SGBV survivors. Local youth have also been engaged on social cohesion and fostering peace. Overall, project interventions are contributing to strengthening reconciliation, healing, and peace in the target communities. Whilst the recruitment of project staff continue, UNDP has launched a consultancy notice for an MHPSS expert to provide interim technical assistance and quality assurance to the implementing partners on the provision of MHPSS and multi-sectional studies on SGBV and its impact on social cohesion.

Under this outcome, activities geared towards strengthening key institutions, structures, and stakeholders' capacities to promote mental health, provision of quality and comprehensive GBV, psychosocial services, and livelihood support for survivors have commenced and are contributing to overall results.

The Government is being supported through the Ministry of Gender, Children and Social Welfare to strengthen the Sexual Offenses Amendment Bill in collaboration with the Ministry of Justice, to incorporate the establishment of Gender-based Violence (GBV) special courts in the bill in the High Courts of The Gambia.

Some key capacity building activities completed are a ten-day residential training for 25 medical doctors (14 women and 11 men) on the collection of forensic evidence and clinical management of rape. The overall objective of this training is to encourage survivors to access confidential and quality medical services, as a first step to accessing justice. The project is also supporting the establishment of a GBV special court to expedite SGBV cases whilst guaranteeing adequate protection of survivors and other witnesses. Training on MHPSS and psychosocial first aid has also been provided for 20 social and health workers (11 women and 9 men) and the project is supporting the mentoring of these trained social and health workers. Overall, these efforts have increased the capacity of the trained doctors and social workers and promoted positive attitudinal change, which we expect to strengthen service delivery and quality of care for SGBV survivors.

Furthermore, three Community Healing Cycle sessions on MHPSS were conducted for 40 SGBV survivors (10 male and 30 female) who participated in the TRRC process in Sintet, one of the targeted communities under the project. In 2009, a "witch-hunt" cleansing campaign in Sintet, Essau, Jambur and other communities resulted in up to 1,000 cases of the human rights violations and abuses by some estimates (Amnesty International), many of which included SGBV according to the TRRC Final Report. These sessions in Sintet provided psychosocial counseling and therapy management to reduce mental health trauma, foster reconciliation, healing, and peace in the community. As a result of these Community Healing Cycle sessions in Sintet, 7 survivors are being provided with tailored, advanced mental health services through the One-stop Centers, following referrals made by health and social workers. These survivors are being provided with various services ranging from medical, safety, and livelihood support. 10 Survivors (2 men and 8 women) are also currently undergoing livelihood training to enhance personal empowerment and aid their reintegration back into society.

Gender equality and women empowerment were consistently promoted under this outcome, particularly during activities which provided MHPSS at the community level for survivors of GBV that participated in the TRRC process, where 90% of the beneficiaries were women. Women were also prioritized during the livelihood support training and empowerment strategies provided. The spin off effect of these targeted interventions towards women, which this project identifies as the population most affected by SGBV, goes beyond their reintegration into society but advances their prospects for economic empowerment through livelihood support and entrepreneurial skills. Combined, these efforts are expected to result in both the individual well being of the survivor and collectively, build community resilience and social cohesion.

Under this outcome, activities geared toward strengthening local peace structures to increase access to mental health and psychosocial support for SGBV survivors are been implemented by partners through intergenerational dialogue sessions in selected communities under the project. These dialogue sessions will upscale and enhance reconciliation, and peacebuilding at the community level. A international MHPSS specialist is also currently being recruited to provide technical assistance and quality assurance to project partners, including local authorities and CSOs to firstly, reduce stigma and promote community-based approaches to MHPSS, and secondly, to enhance research, study and programming of future interventions on community based reconciliation, social cohesion and peacebuilding. The selected applicant is expected to commence this assignment in July 2022 for 6 months.
