## Main implementation constraints & challenges (2-3 sentences)

1. Delays in rehabilitation for two months due to the fact that the MOE - Baghdad was unable to meet the planned date to confirm the premises on time for renovation.

2. Delays for 7 months due to delay of MOE in providing the customs exemption letter for the TV production equipments. This is partially due to the attacks that took place against MOFA in August 2009.
